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## Ten-Year Tuition and Fees Comparative Analysis - 1 -

This study presents a comparative analysis of the annual tuition and fees of the University of Georgia (UGA) within three different groups: UGA Comparator Peer Institutions, UGA Aspirational Peer Institutions, and Southern Regional Education Board Institutions (SREB). Ten years of data on total annual tuition and fees were examined for all three groups at both the undergraduate and graduate level for resident and nonresident students.

Comparator and Aspirational peers each include a group of 12 universities defined by UGA and the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia. SREB consists of a group of 15 universities, each from a different state within the southern region in the United States. Selected results are highlighted for each group, followed by full data tables and charts. Two separate average values are provided within each table: a group average, which does not include UGA and an average for all institutions, which includes UGA. In order to compare UGA to its different peer groupings, the former average value is used throughout the text and the graphs of this report.

### UGA Comparator Peer Institutions

#### Undergraduate

##### *Residents*

- The average 10-year increase in tuition and fees for residents was 111%. The University of Georgia's increase was 156%, 3<sup>rd</sup> highest out of 13 institutions.
- The largest increase occurred at University of Arizona (231%), University of California-Davis (185%), and University of Georgia (156%).
- The lowest increases were at University of Maryland (58%), Louisiana State University (65%), and University of Missouri (85%).
- Over the past 5 years the University of Georgia has had the highest increase (89%), followed by University of Arizona (83%), and University of California-Davis (75%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Maryland has had the lowest increase (8%), followed by Ohio State University (17%), and University of Missouri (22%).

##### *Non-Residents*

- The average 10-year increase in tuition and fees for non-residents was 94%. The University of Georgia's increase was 138%, 2<sup>nd</sup> highest out of 13 institutions.
- The largest increases occurred at University of Florida (163%), University of Georgia (138%), and University of Arizona (138%).
- The lowest increases were at North Carolina State University (43%), University of Missouri (58%), and University of Kentucky and Iowa State University with an increase of 72% each.
- Over the past 5 years University of Arizona has had the highest increase (80%), followed by University of Georgia (60%) and University of Florida (59%).
- Over the past 5 years North Carolina State University has had the lowest increase (15%), followed by Iowa State University (18%) and Ohio State University (22%).

## UGA Comparator Peer Institutions

### Graduate

#### *Residents*

- The average 10-year increase in tuition and fees for residents was 109%. The University of Georgia's increase was 110%, 5<sup>th</sup> highest out of 13 institutions.
- The largest increases occurred at the University of Arizona (263%), University of Florida (178%), and University of California-Davis (132%).
- The lowest increases were at University of Missouri (72%), University of Maryland (75%), and Ohio State University (79%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Arizona has had the highest increase (96%), followed by University of Florida (75%), and University of Georgia (54%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Missouri has had the lowest increase (17%), followed by Iowa State University (24%), and University of California-Davis (25%).

#### *Non-Residents*

- The average 10-year increase in tuition and fees for non-residents was 85%. The University of Georgia's increase was lower than this average at 73%, 9<sup>th</sup> highest out of 13 institutions.
- The largest increases occurred at University of Arizona (140%), University of Maryland (137%), and University of Florida (107%).
- The lowest increases were at North Carolina State University (38%), University of Missouri (48%), and Ohio State University (66%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Arizona has had the highest increase (79%), followed by Michigan State University (45%), and University of Kentucky (37%).
- Over the past 5 years North Carolina State University has had the lowest increase (13%), followed by University of Missouri (17%), and University of Georgia (17%).

## UGA Aspirational Peer Institutions

### Undergraduate

#### *Residents*

- The average 10-year increase in tuition and fees for residents was 117%. The University of Georgia's increase was 156%, 2<sup>nd</sup> highest out of 13 institutions.
- The largest increases occurred at University of California - Berkeley (165%), University of Georgia (156%), and University of California-Los Angeles (155%).
- The lowest increases were at University of Michigan (71%), Pennsylvania State University (95%), and Cornell University (State) (95%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Georgia has had the highest increase (89%), followed by University of California - Berkeley (68%) and University of California-Los Angeles (66%).
- Over the past 5 years Pennsylvania State University has had the lowest increase (25%), followed by University of Michigan (28%) and The University of Texas (35%).

#### *Non-Residents*

- The average 10-year increase in tuition and fees for non-residents was 90%. The University of Georgia's increase was 138%, 2<sup>nd</sup> highest out of 13 institutions.
- The largest increases occurred at The University of Texas (209%), University of Georgia (138%), and University of California - Berkeley (123%).
- The lowest increases were at University of Wisconsin (52%), University of Minnesota (59%), and University of Michigan (66%).
- Over the past 5 years The University of Texas has had the highest increase (91%), followed by the University of Georgia (60%), and University of California - Berkeley (41%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Minnesota has had the lowest increase (18%), followed by University of Wisconsin (20%), and Pennsylvania State University (21%).

## UGA Aspirational Peer Institutions

### Graduate

#### *Residents*

- The average 10-year increase in tuition and fees for residents was 98%. The University of Georgia's increase was 110%, 8<sup>th</sup> highest out of 13 institutions.
- The largest increases occurred at University of Virginia (168%), University of California - Berkeley (152%), and University of Texas (148%).
- The lowest increases were at Cornell University-State (50%), University of Michigan (56%), and University of Wisconsin (72%).
- Over the past 5 years University of North Carolina has had the highest increase (64%), followed by University of Texas (59%), and University of Georgia (54%).
- Over the past 5 years Cornell University-State has had the lowest increase (8%), followed by University of Wisconsin (25%) and University of Michigan (26%).

#### *Non-Residents*

- The average 10-year increase in tuition and fees for non-residents was 61%. The University of Georgia's increase was 73%, 5<sup>th</sup> highest out of 13 institutions.
- The largest increases occurred at University of Texas (111%), University of Illinois (87%), and Pennsylvania State University (79%).
- The lowest increases were at University of Wisconsin (22%), University of Virginia (31%), and Cornell University - State (50%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Texas has had the highest increase (35%), followed by University of Washington (28%), and University of Michigan (26%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Wisconsin has had the lowest increase (5%), followed by Cornell University - State (8%), and University of California - Berkeley (11%).

- The largest increases occurred at University of Georgia (156%), University of Texas (150%), and University of Oklahoma (150%).
- The lowest increases were at University of Mississippi (50%), University of Maryland (58%), and Louisiana State University (65%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Georgia has had the highest increase (89%), followed by University of Florida (63%) and University of Alabama (62%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Maryland has had the lowest increase (8%), followed by University of Arkansas (23%) and University of Mississippi (26%).

*Non-Residents*

- The average 10-year increase in tuition and fees for non-residents was 104%. The University of Georgia's increase was 138%, 3<sup>rd</sup> highest out of 16 institutions.
- The largest increases occurred at University of Texas (209%), University of Florida (163%), and University of Georgia (138%).
- The lowest increases were at University of Arkansas (70%), University of Mississippi (70%), and University of Kentucky (72%).
- Over the past 5 years University of Texas has had the highest increase (91%), followed by University of Georgia (60%) and University of Florida (59%).

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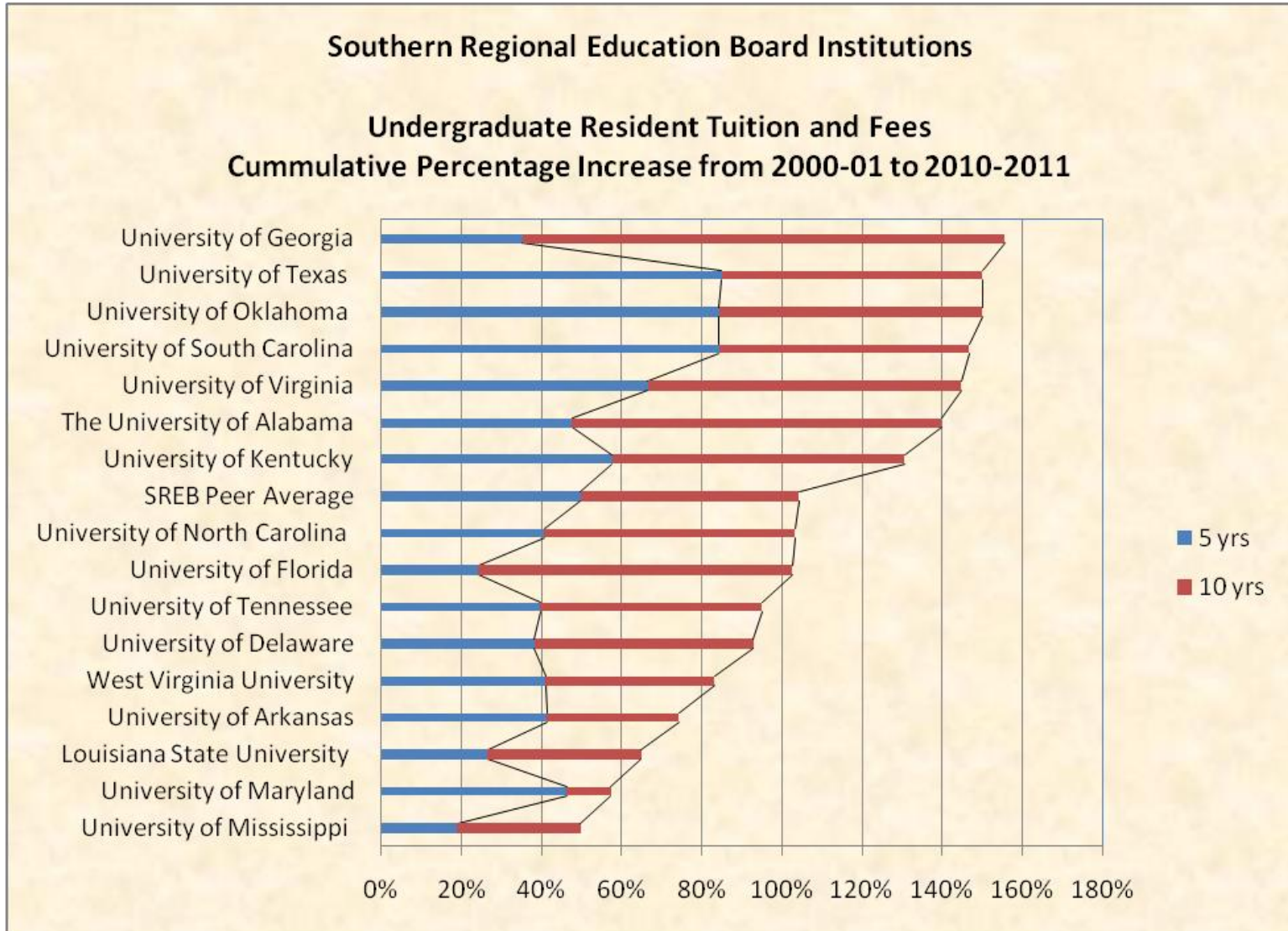

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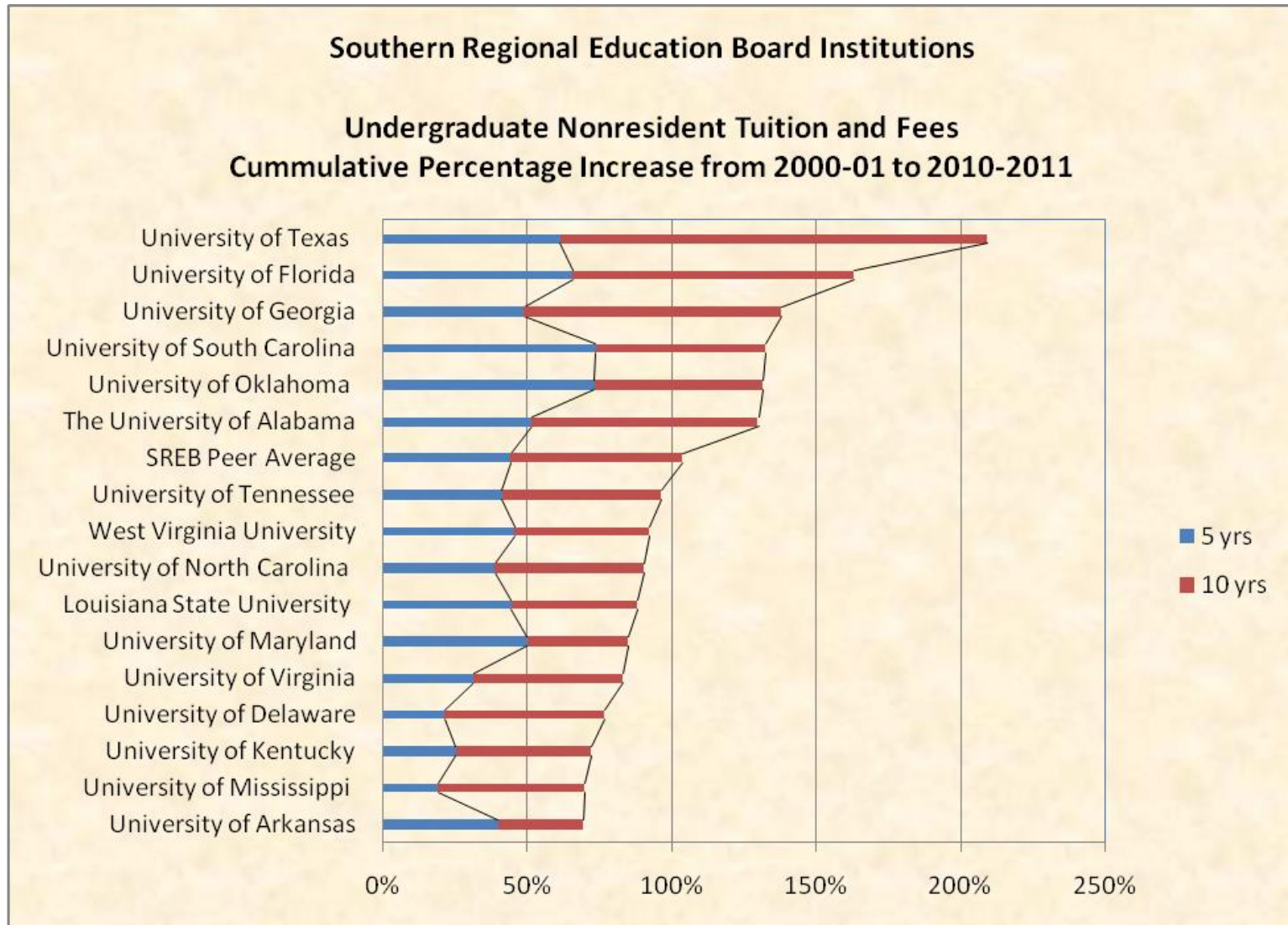
