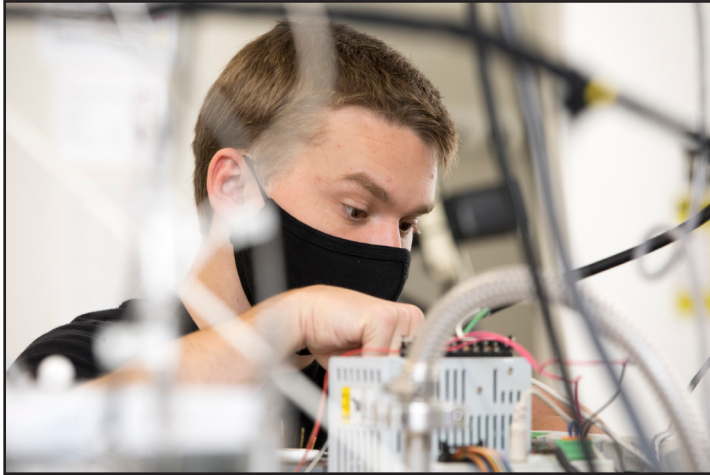

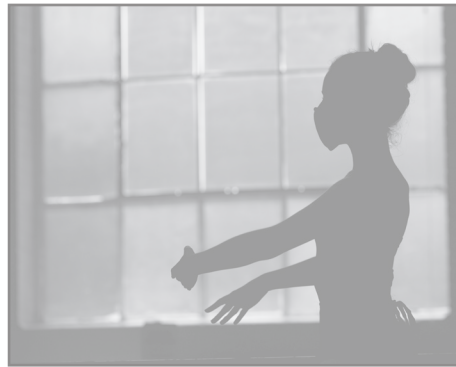

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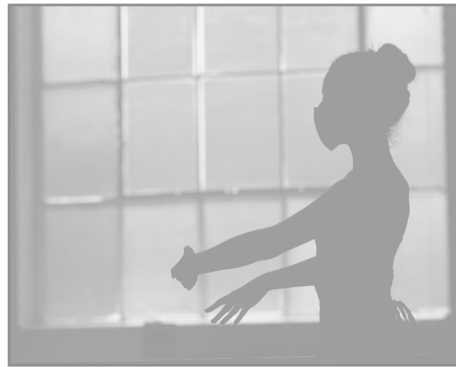
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General Information

ABOUT THE INSTITUTION

History and Location: Chartered by the Georgia General Assembly on January 27, 1785, The University of Georgia is the nation's first state-chartered university. In 1872, the University of Georgia was designated the state's land-grant institution and in 1980 was accorded sea-grant college status. The University's main campus is located in Athens-Clarke County, Georgia, approximately 60 miles northeast of the state capital of Atlanta.

Academic Schools and Colleges: The University is comprised of seventeen schools and colleges: Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, Arts and Sciences, Business, Ecology, Education, Engineering, Environment and Design, Family and Consumer Sciences, Forestry and Natural Resources, Graduate School, Journalism and Mass Communication, Law, Pharmacy, Public Health, Public and International Affairs, Social Work, and Veterinary Medicine.

Academic Programs and Degrees Conferred: The University of Georgia is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges as well as a variety of discipline-specific accrediting agencies. Academic offerings include 24 bachelor's degrees in 143 major fields; 33 master's degrees in 144 major fields; the specialist in education degree in 8 major fields; 4 doctoral degrees in 99 major fields; and professional degrees in Law, Pharmacy, and Veterinary Medicine. During the 2019-20 fiscal year, the University awarded 7,994 bachelor's degrees, 2,062 master's and specialist degrees, 528 doctoral degrees, and 431 professional degrees.

Faculty: Full-time professorial faculty in the fall of 2020 totaled 1,829. 95% of the full-time faculty were tenured or tenure-track, and 97% hold the doctorate or other terminal degree. Average salaries for the fiscal year 2020 were \$136,600 for professors; \$100,700 for associate professors; and \$93,200 for assistant professors.

Enrollment: Fall 2020 enrollment totaled 39,147, which included 29,765 undergraduates, 7,779 graduate students, and 1,603 first professional students. 94% of undergraduates and 75% of graduate and professional students were enrolled on a full-time basis. The undergraduate student body was 42% male and 30% minority. There were 117 foreign countries represented among the 895 undergraduate and 1,547 graduate and professional non-US citizens enrolled in fall 2020.

Admissions/Retention: 5,603 first-time freshmen enrolled for fall 2020. 41% of all admitted freshmen enrolled, and 20% of all freshman applicants enrolled. The average total SAT score for entering freshmen was 1318. 4,764 or 85% of new freshmen attended 477 Georgia high schools. On average, 94.8% of first-time full-time freshmen return for their sophomore year. 79% of all undergraduate transfer applicants were accepted, and 1,421 enrolled for fall 2020. 49% of accepted new graduate students enrolled in fall 2020.

Costs: Academic year 2020-21 tuition and fees totaled \$12,080 for new resident undergraduates and \$31,120 for new nonresident undergraduates. Academic year 2020-21 estimated cost of attendance for resident undergraduates totaled \$27,658. This amount included tuition, mandatory fees, books, supplies, room, board, and other expenses.

Finance: For fiscal year 2020, total revenues exceeded \$1.96 billion and included \$529.9 million from state appropriations. 18.0% of total operating expenditures were designated for instruction and 24.5% for research. Research expenditures for fiscal year 2020 exceeded \$495.1 million.

Physical Facilities: The University occupies and maintains over 22 million square feet of space. The main campus includes 484 buildings for a total of 18,472,117 square feet. Ten major building projects were completed during 2020 for a total cost of over \$82 million. The University's fall 2020 land holdings totaled 38,839 acres in 30 Georgia counties.

THE MISSION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA

The University of Georgia, a land-grant and sea-grant university with statewide commitments and responsibilities, is the state's oldest, most comprehensive and most diversified institution of higher education. Its motto, "to teach, to serve, and to inquire into the nature of things," reflects the University's integral and unique role in the conservation and enhancement of the state's and nation's intellectual, cultural, and environmental heritage.

The University of Georgia shares with the other research universities of the University System of Georgia the following core characteristics:

- a statewide responsibility and commitment to excellence and academic achievements having national and international recognition;
- a commitment to excellence in a teaching/learning environment dedicated to serving a diverse and well-prepared student body, to promoting high levels of student achievement, and to providing appropriate academic support services;
- a commitment to excellence in research, scholarship, and creative endeavors that are focused on organized programs to create, maintain, and apply new knowledge and theories; that promote instructional quality and effectiveness; and that enhance institutionally relevant faculty qualifications;
- a commitment to excellence in public service, economic development, and technical assistance activities designed to address the strategic needs of the state of Georgia along with a comprehensive offering of continuing education designed to meet the needs of Georgia's citizens in life-long learning and professional education;
- a wide range of academic and professional programming at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels.

With its statewide mission and core characteristics, the University of Georgia endeavors to prepare the University community and the state for full participation in the global society of the twenty-first century. Through its programs and practices, it seeks to foster the understanding of and respect for cultural differences necessary for an enlightened and educated citizenry. It further provides for cultural, ethnic, gender, and racial diversity in the faculty, staff, and student body. The University is committed to preparing the University community to appreciate the critical importance of a quality environment to an interdependent global society.

As a comprehensive land-grant and sea-grant institution, the University of Georgia offers baccalaureate, master's, doctoral, and professional degrees in the arts, humanities, social sciences, biological sciences, physical sciences, agricultural and environmental sciences, business, ecology, engineering, environmental design, family and consumer sciences, forest resources, journalism and mass communication, education, law, pharmacy, public health, social work, and veterinary medicine. The university is also home to the Augusta University/University of Georgia Medical Partnership.

The University attracts students nationally and internationally as well as from within Georgia. It offers the state's broadest array of possibilities in graduate and professional education, and thus a large minority of the student body is post-baccalaureate. The predominantly Georgian undergraduate student body is a mix of highly qualified students originally admitted as freshmen and selected transfer students principally from other University System institutions.

With original scholarship, basic and applied research, and creative activities constituting an essential core from which to draw, the impact of the land-grant and sea-grant mission is reflected throughout the state. Cooperative extension, continuing education, public service, experiment stations, and technology transfer are all designed to enhance the well-being of the citizens of Georgia through their roles in economic, social, and community development.

As it has been historically, the University of Georgia is responsive to the evolution of the state's educational, social, and economic needs. It aspires through its strategic planning to even closer contact and interaction with public and private institutions throughout the state as well as with the citizens it serves.

UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA 2025 STRATEGIC PLAN

In November 2018, President Morehead charged a committee to develop a new strategic plan to guide the University from 2020 to 2025. The 2025 plan was approved in September 2019 and formally launched with the President's State of the University Address in January 2020. The plan includes 13 institutional goals under three mission-centered strategic directions:

Promoting Excellence in Teaching and Learning

- Expand experiential learning opportunities for all students.
- Enhance training, support, and recognition for all who provide instruction.
- Enhance infrastructure and support for evidence-based teaching methods across the curriculum.
- Promote academic access and success for all students, with particular consideration for underrepresented, rural, first-generation, and other underserved students.

Growing Research, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship

- Provide resources, support, and incentives to nurture a diverse and inclusive culture of excellence in research, innovation, and entrepreneurship.
- Promote collaboration among academic units and between these units and external organizations to drive interdisciplinary research and commercial activity.
- Align the human and physical capital of the University to expand the research enterprise and fuel innovation and entrepreneurship at all levels of the organization.
- Enhance communications about the University's strengths in research, innovation, and entrepreneurship and the impact of those activities on local, state, national, and international communities.

Strengthening Partnerships with Communities across Georgia and around the World

- Increase collaborative, community-focused research, scholarship, technical assistance, and training in Georgia, across the nation, and world.
- Strengthen UGA's role in economic development across the State, with a particular emphasis on underserved communities.
- Broaden opportunities for students to engage with the diversity of communities in Georgia and across the nation and world on locally identified needs and issues.
- Develop high-impact global partnerships that engage and support UGA areas of research and service excellence.
- Strengthen communications regarding how UGA sustainably supports and benefits communities through research, teaching, and public service.

During Academic Year 2019-2020, UGA's major administrative units, including all academic schools and colleges, developed five-year strategic plans designed to support the institutional goals for 2025.

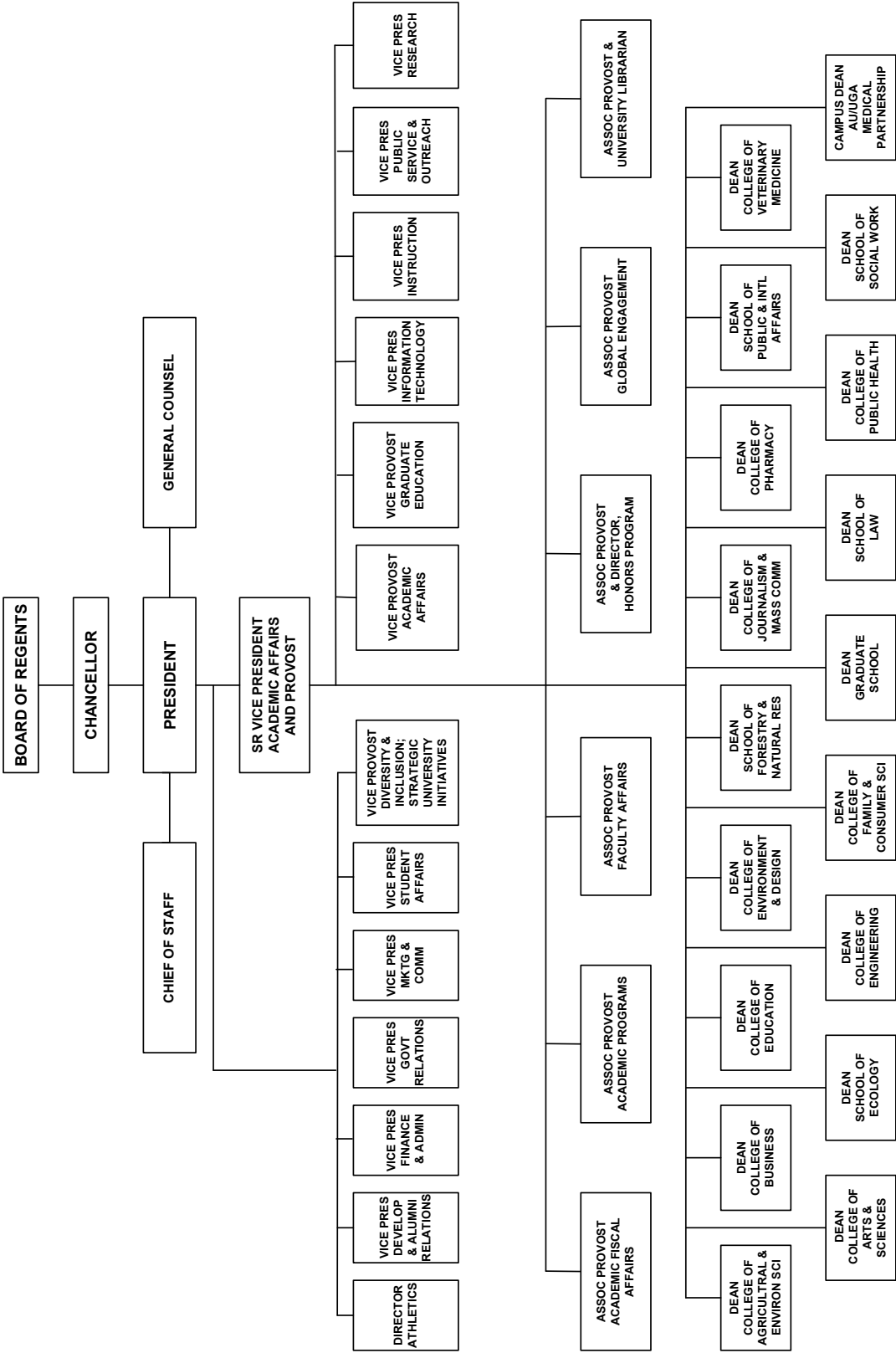

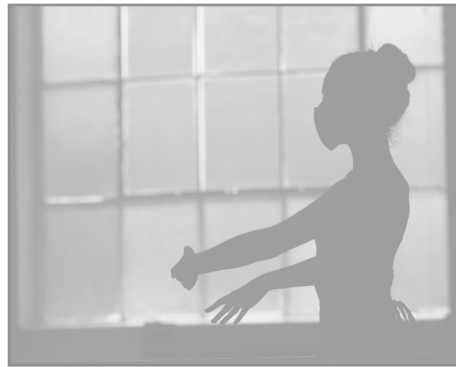

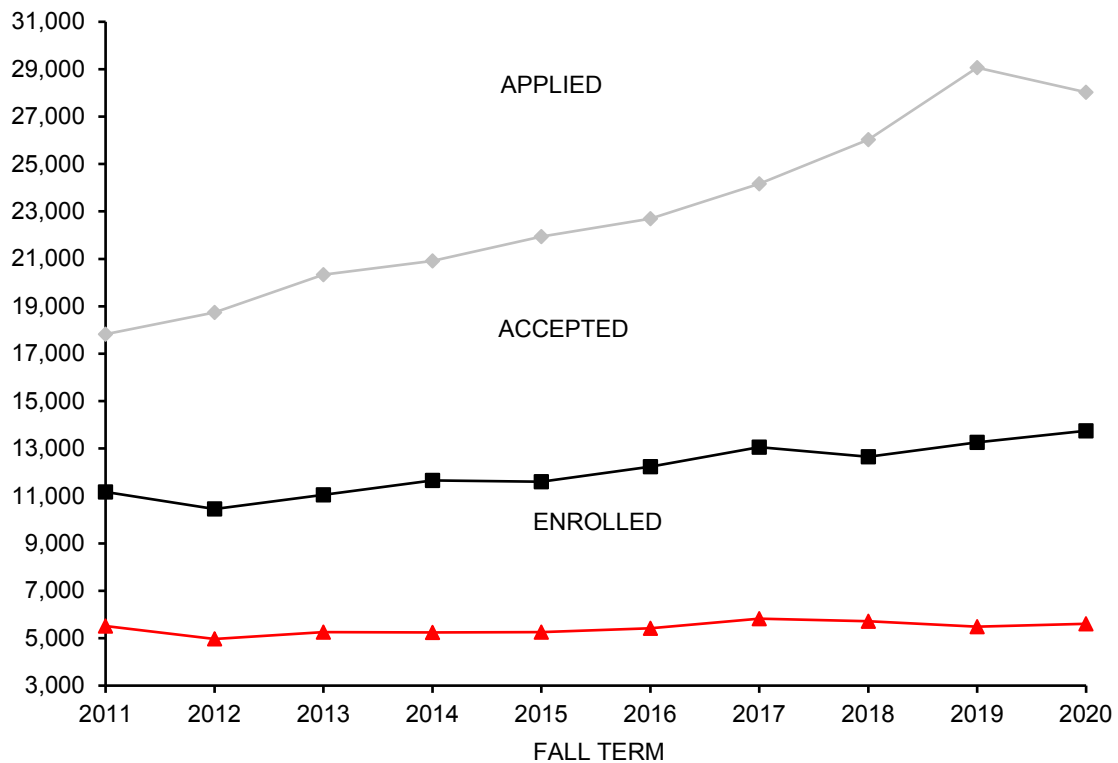

FALL TERMS 2011-2020



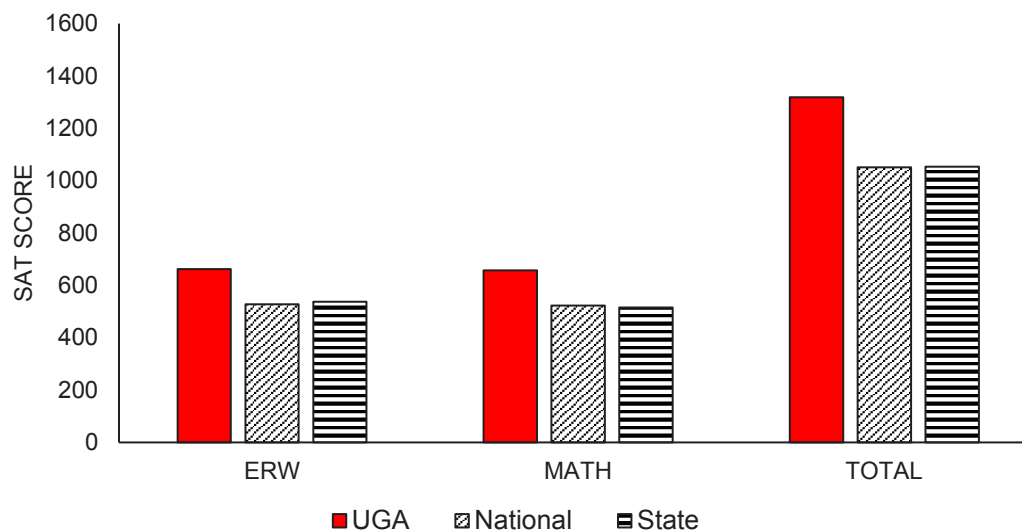

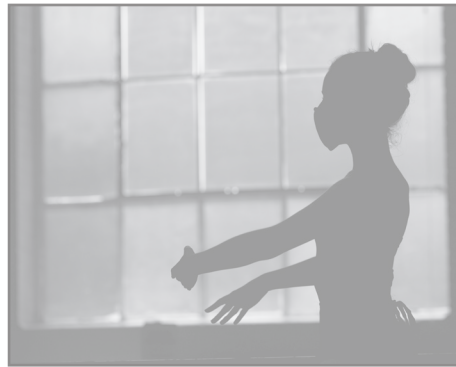

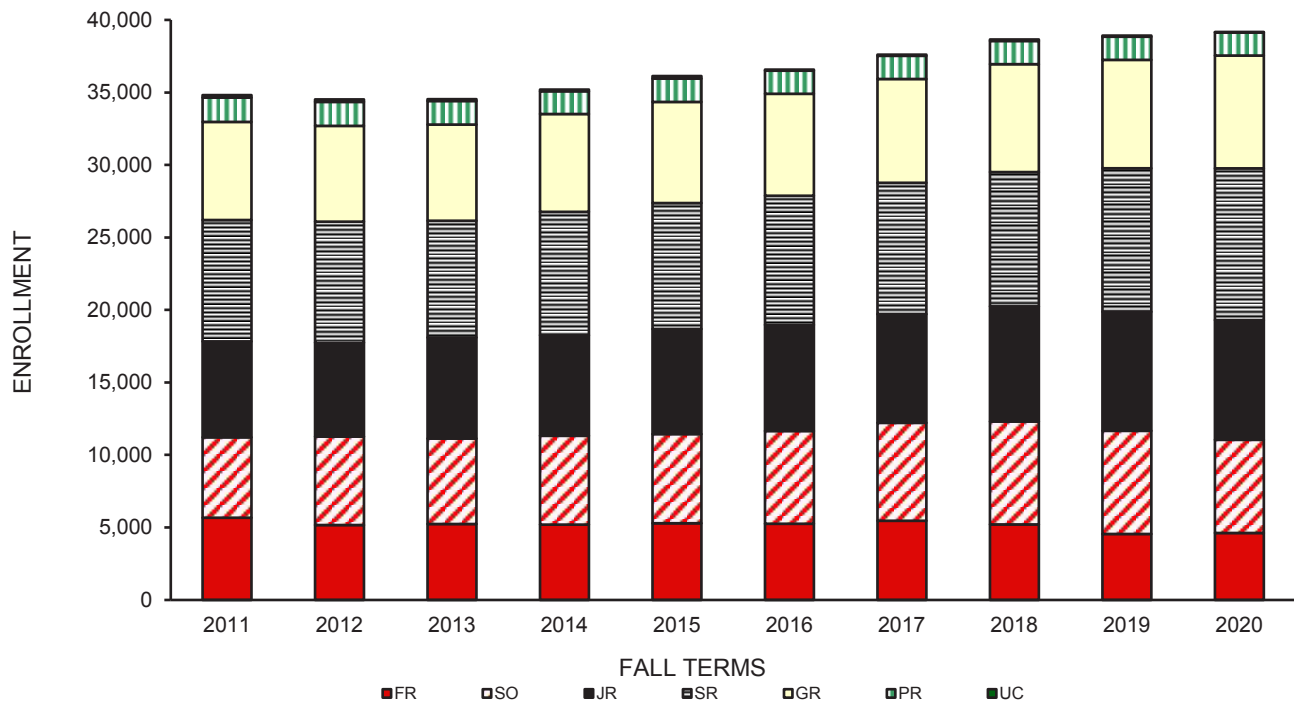

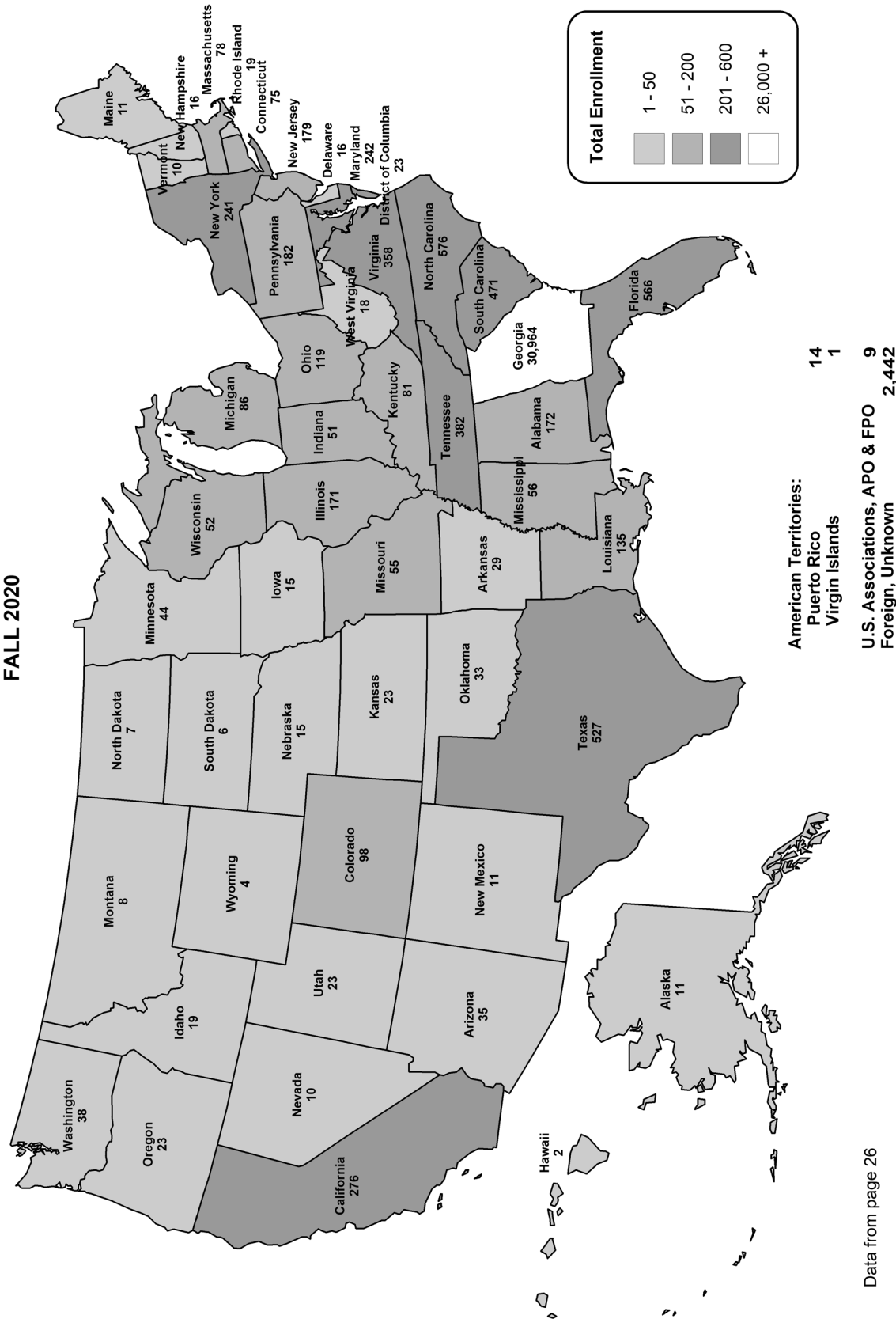

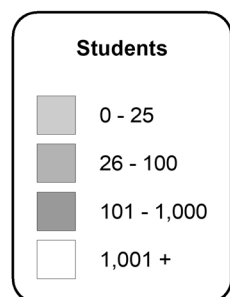

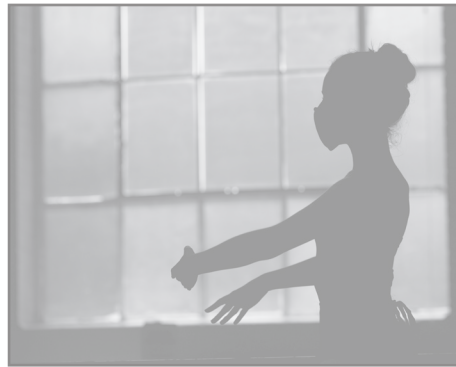

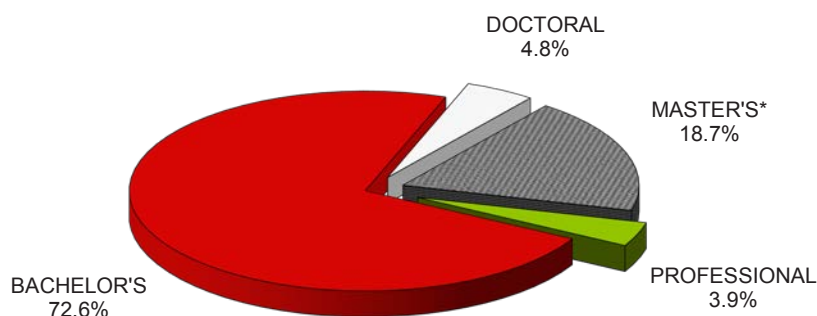

FISCAL YEAR 2019-20**



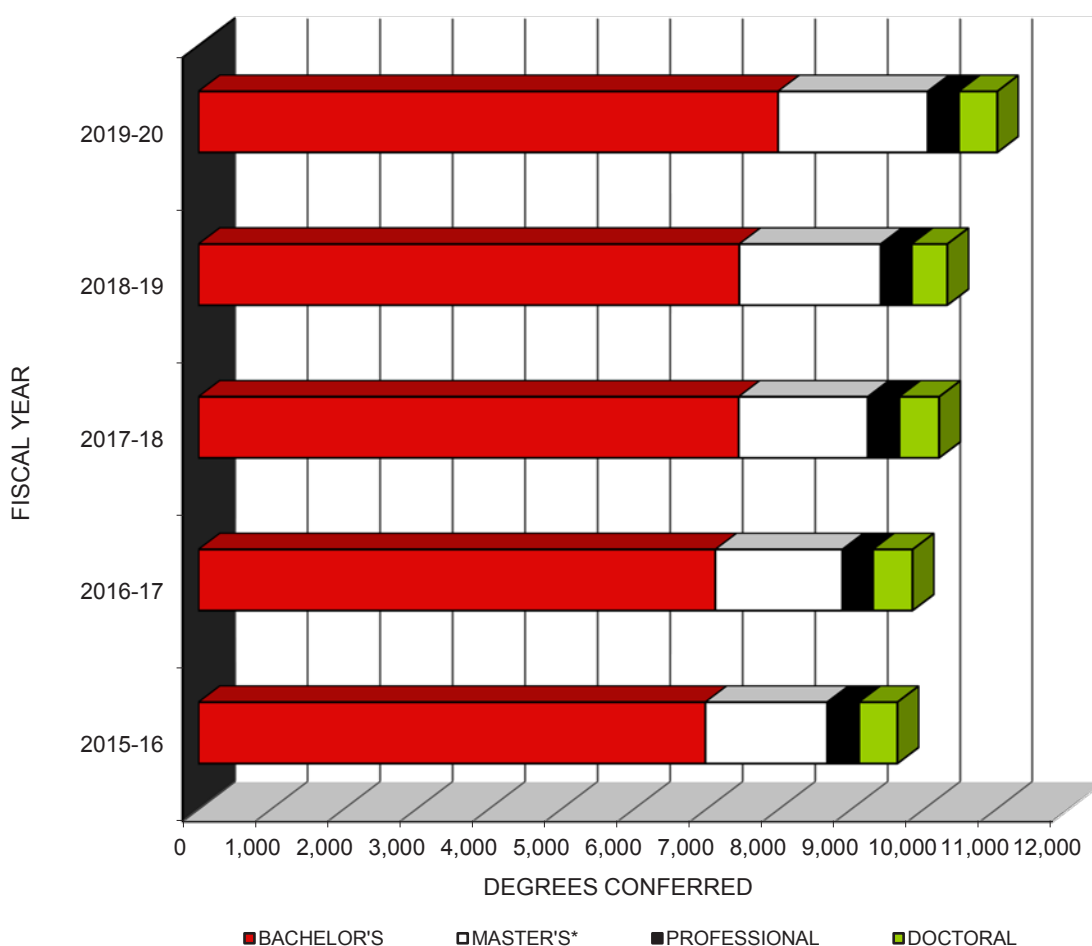

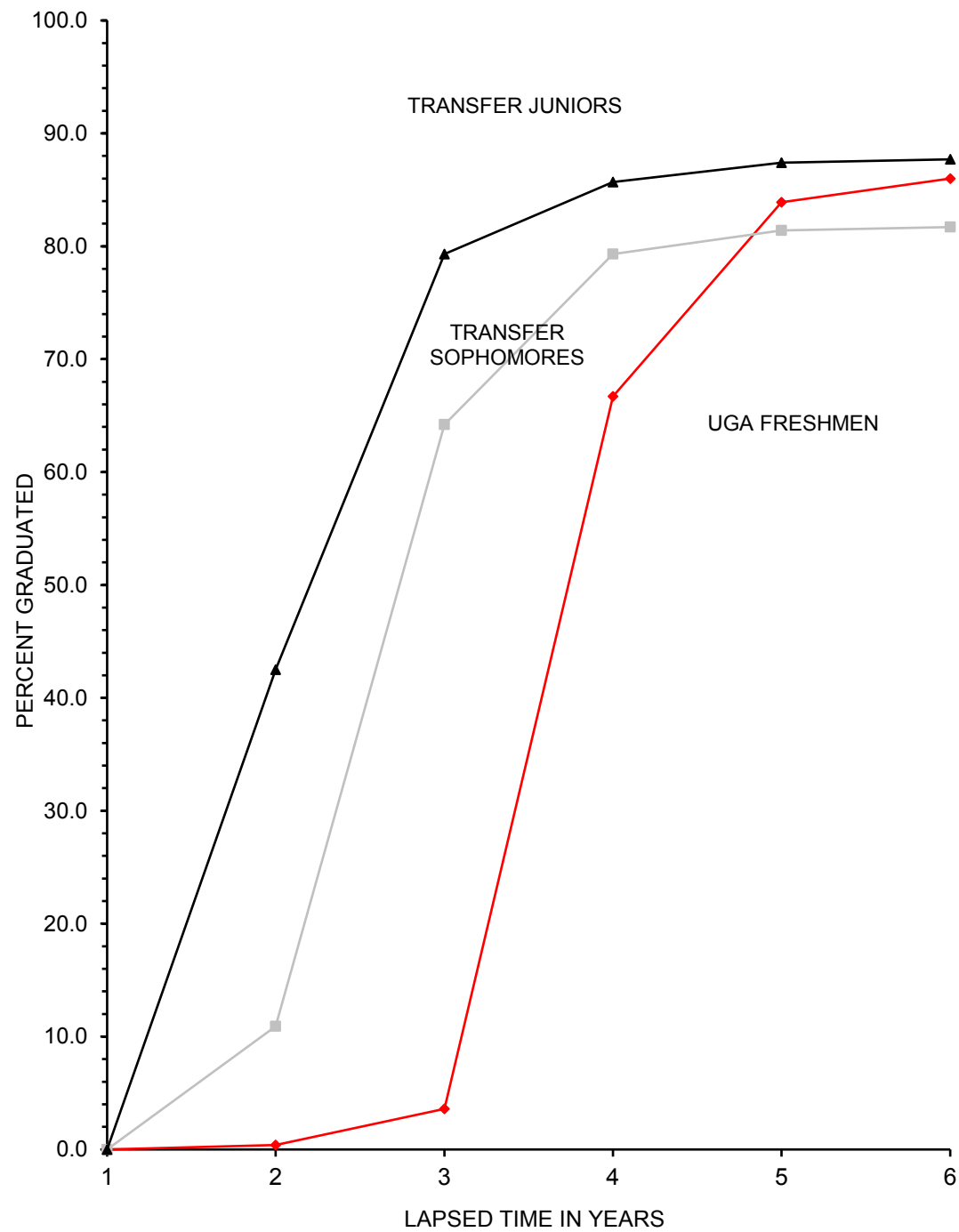

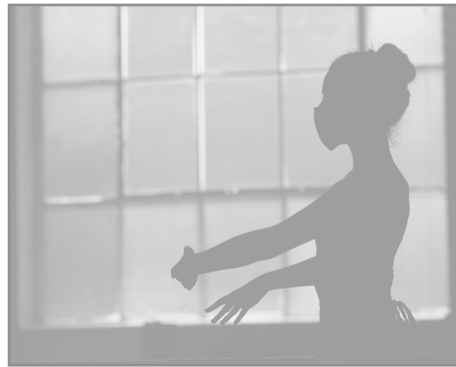

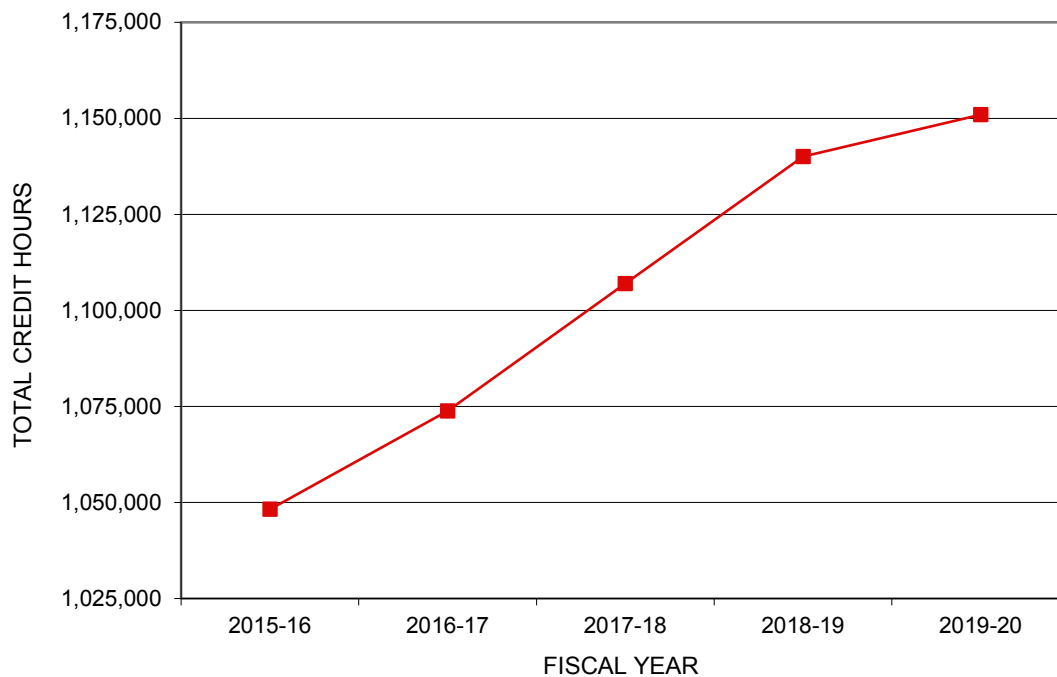

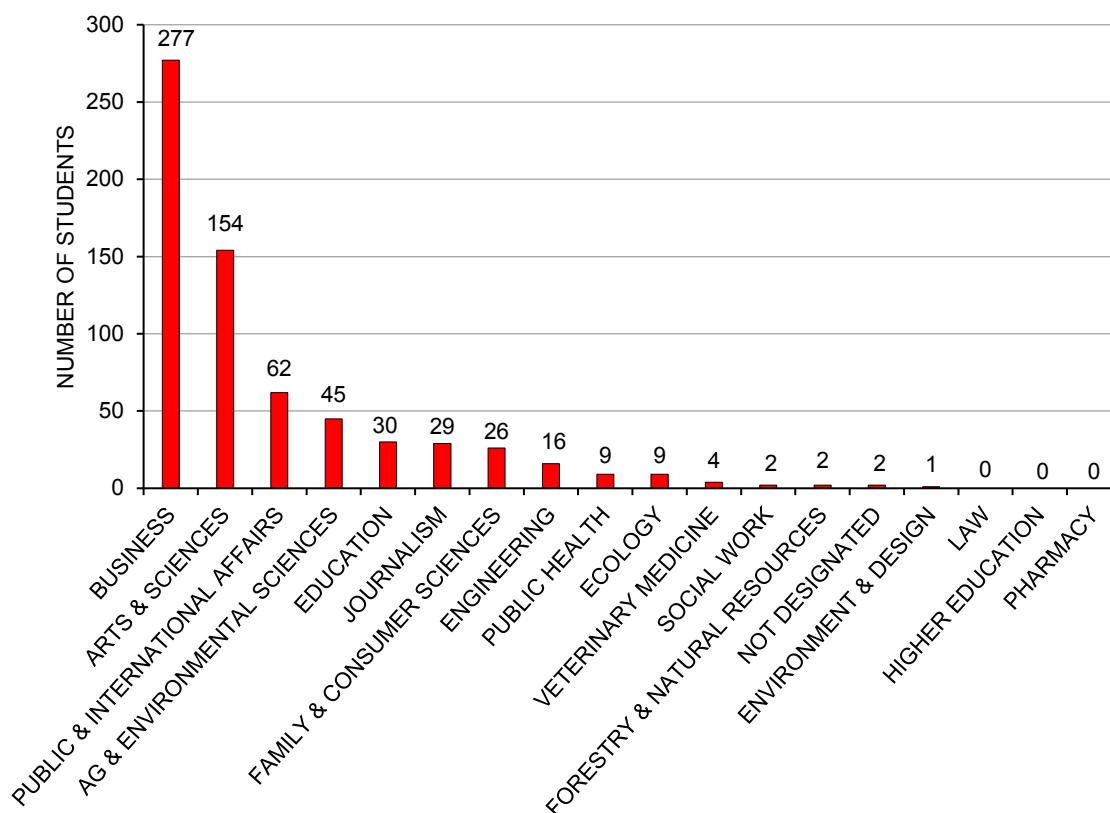

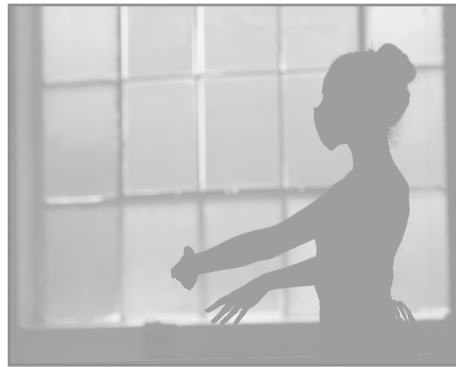

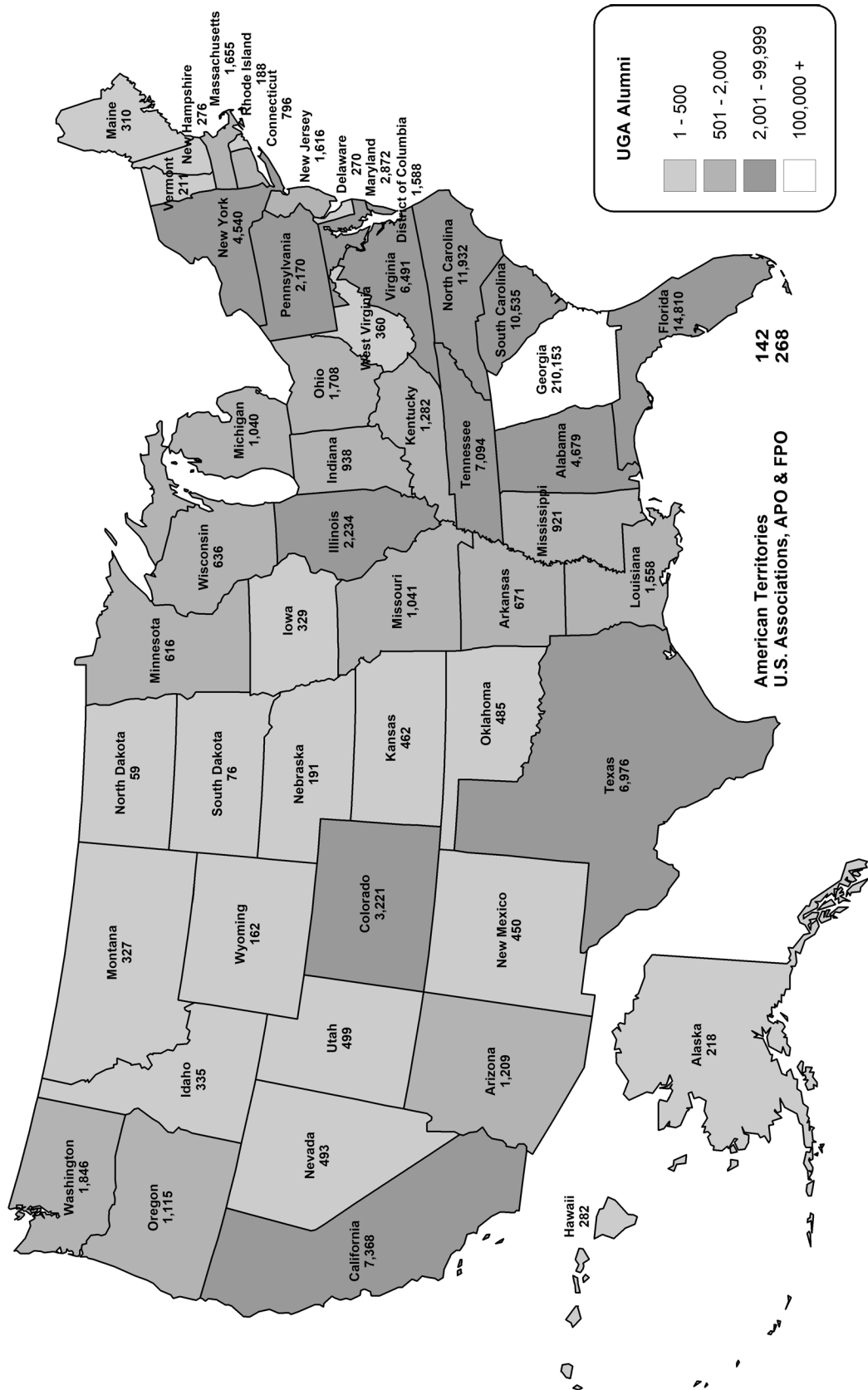

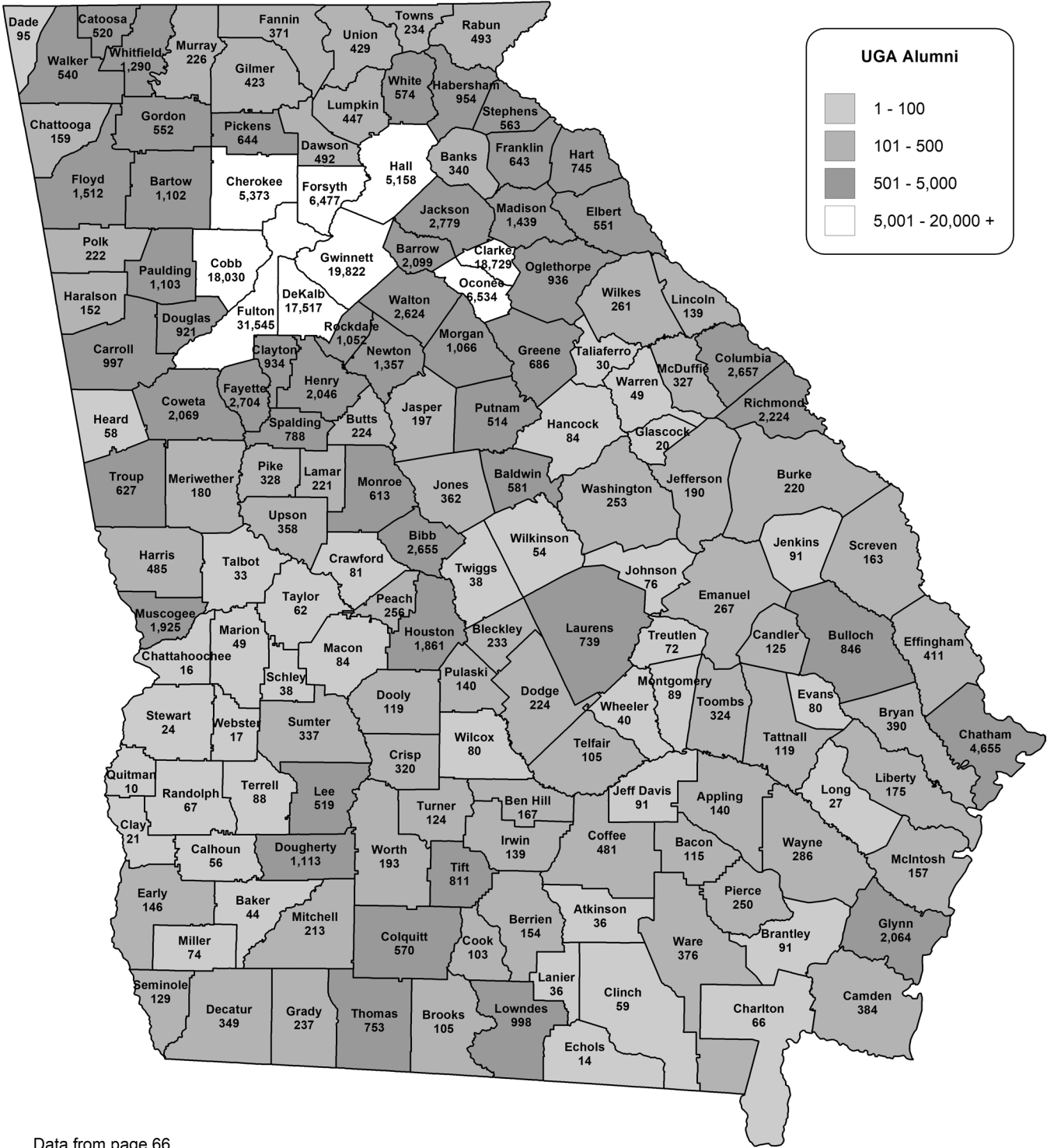

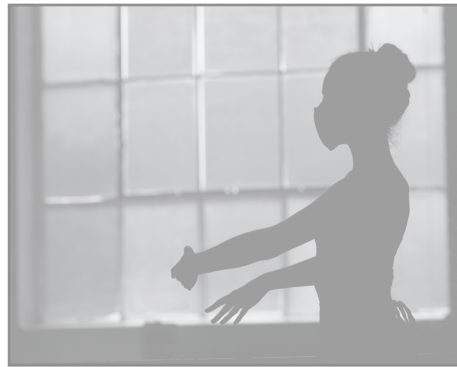

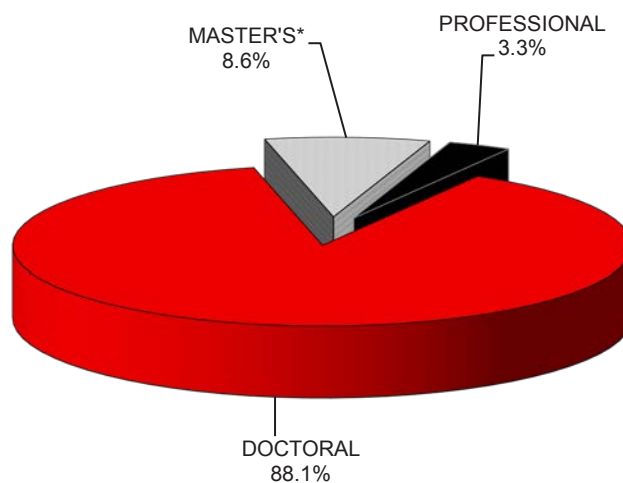

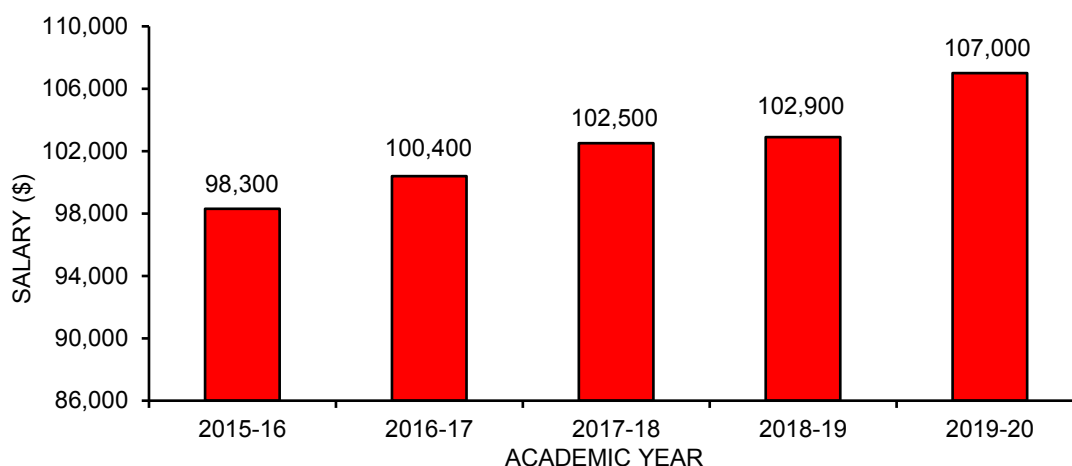

ACADEMIC YEARS 2015-16 THROUGH 2019-20**



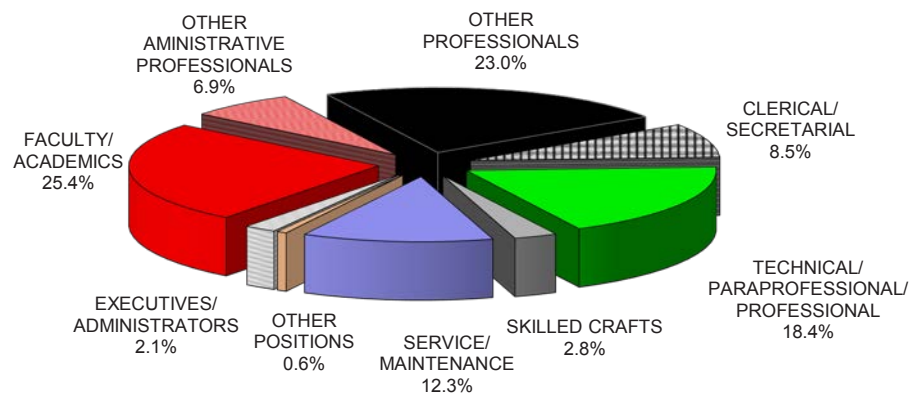

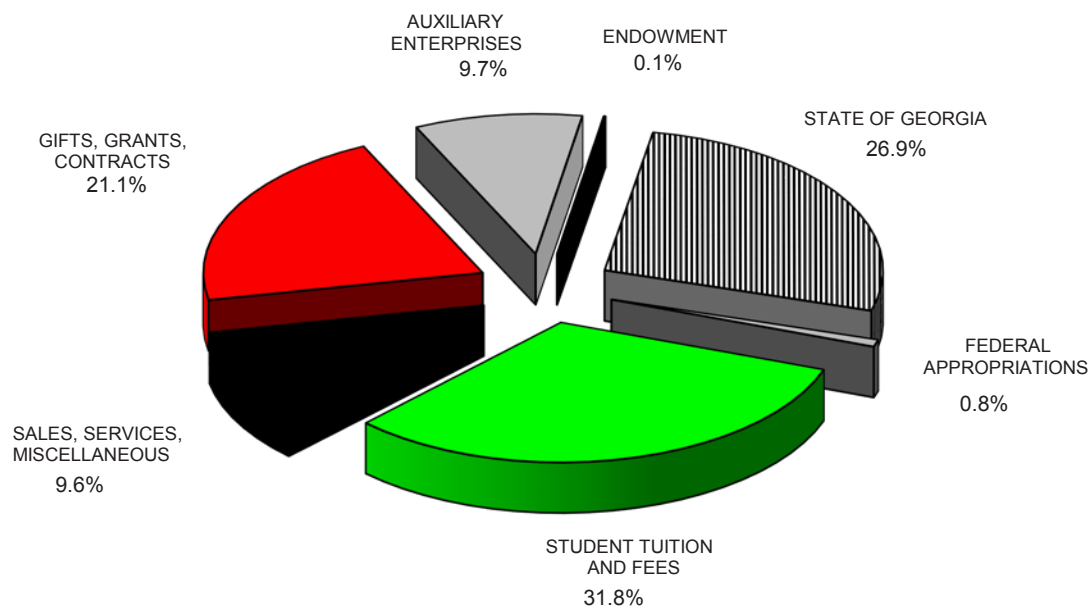

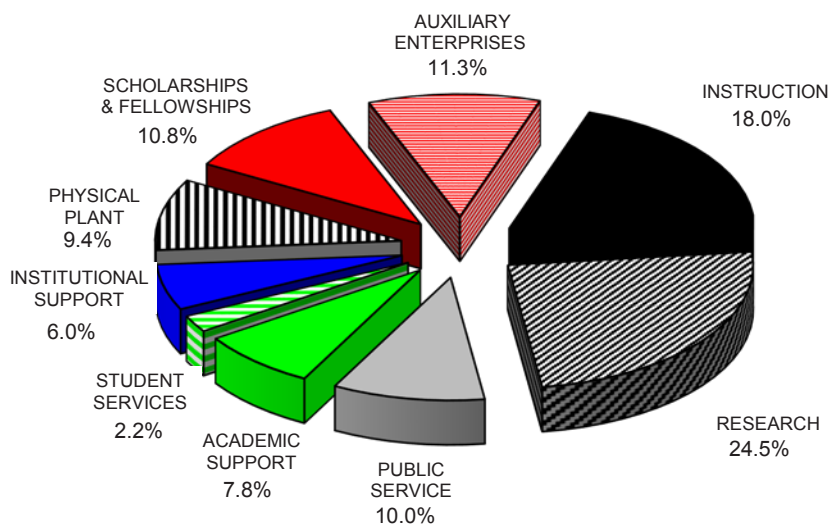

RESEARCH EXPENDITURES BY MAJOR FUNDING SOURCE FISCAL YEARS 2011 THROUGH 2020

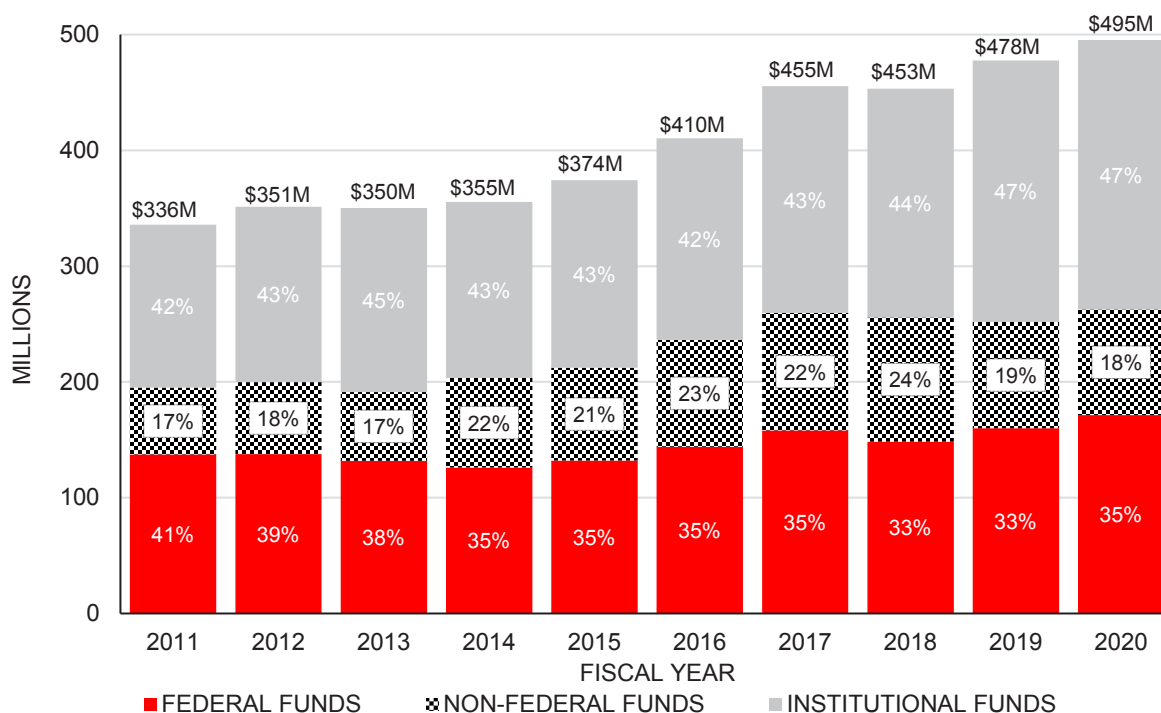
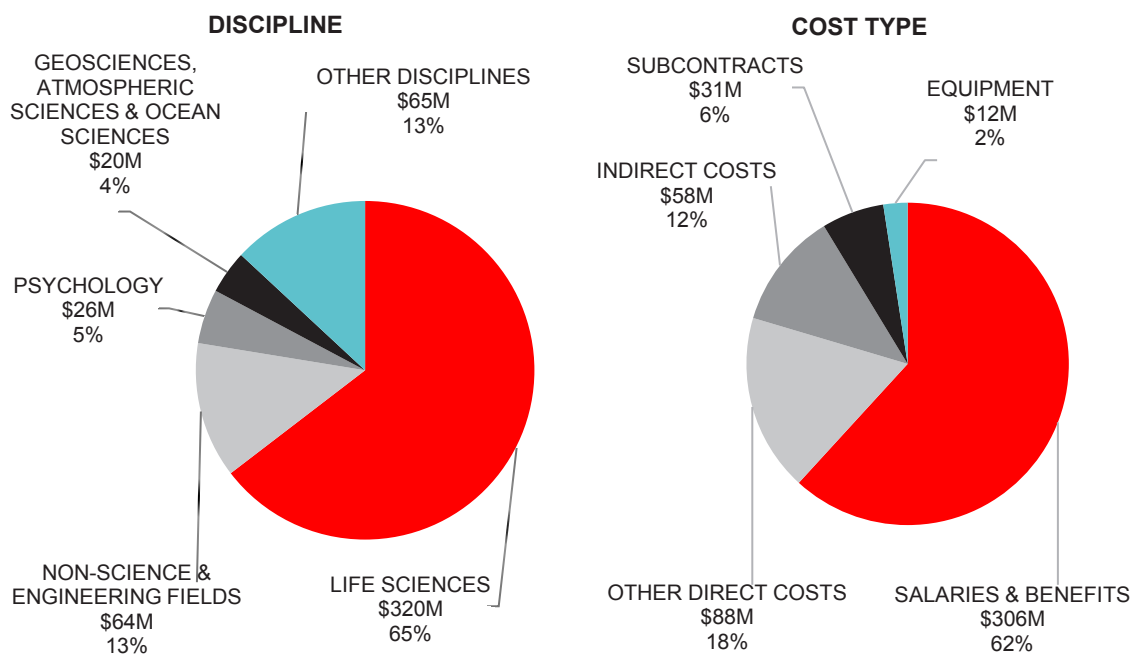

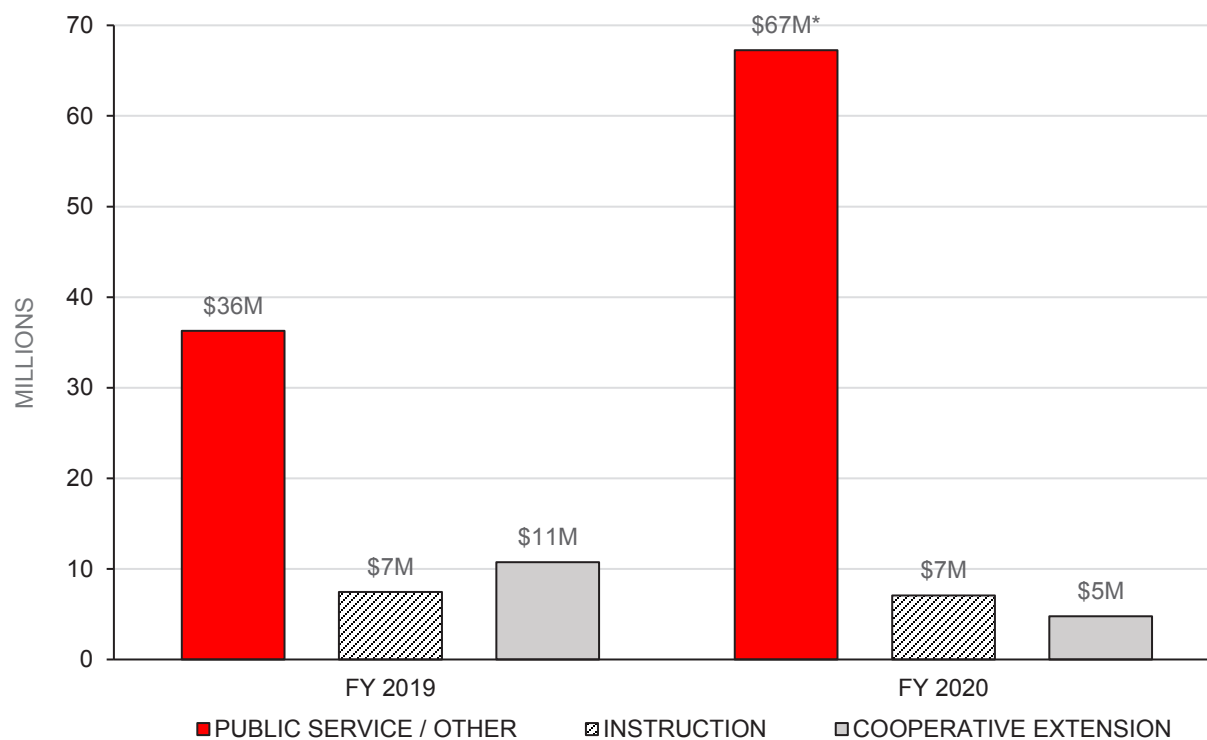

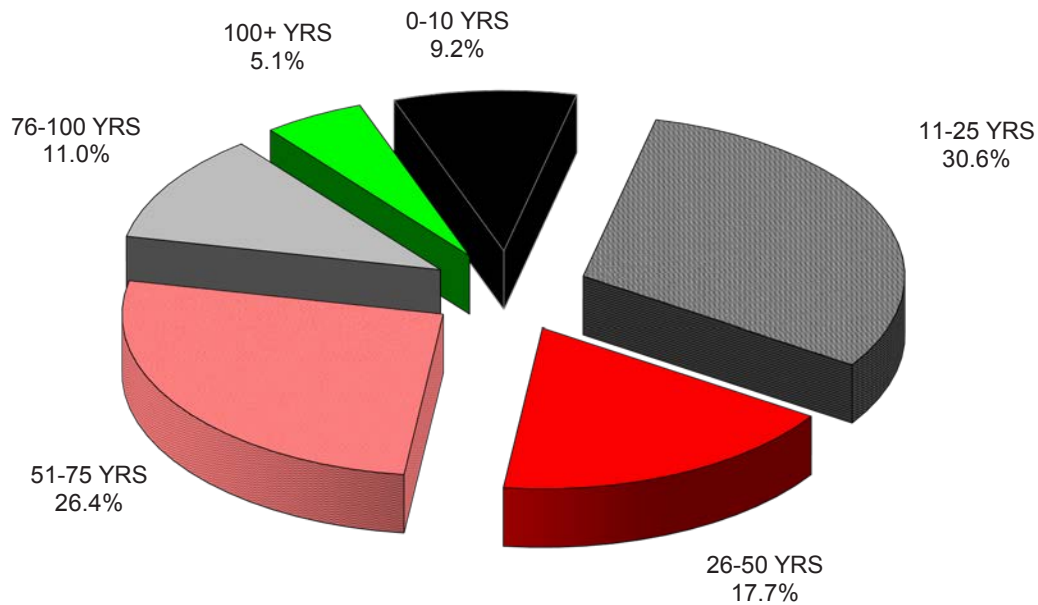

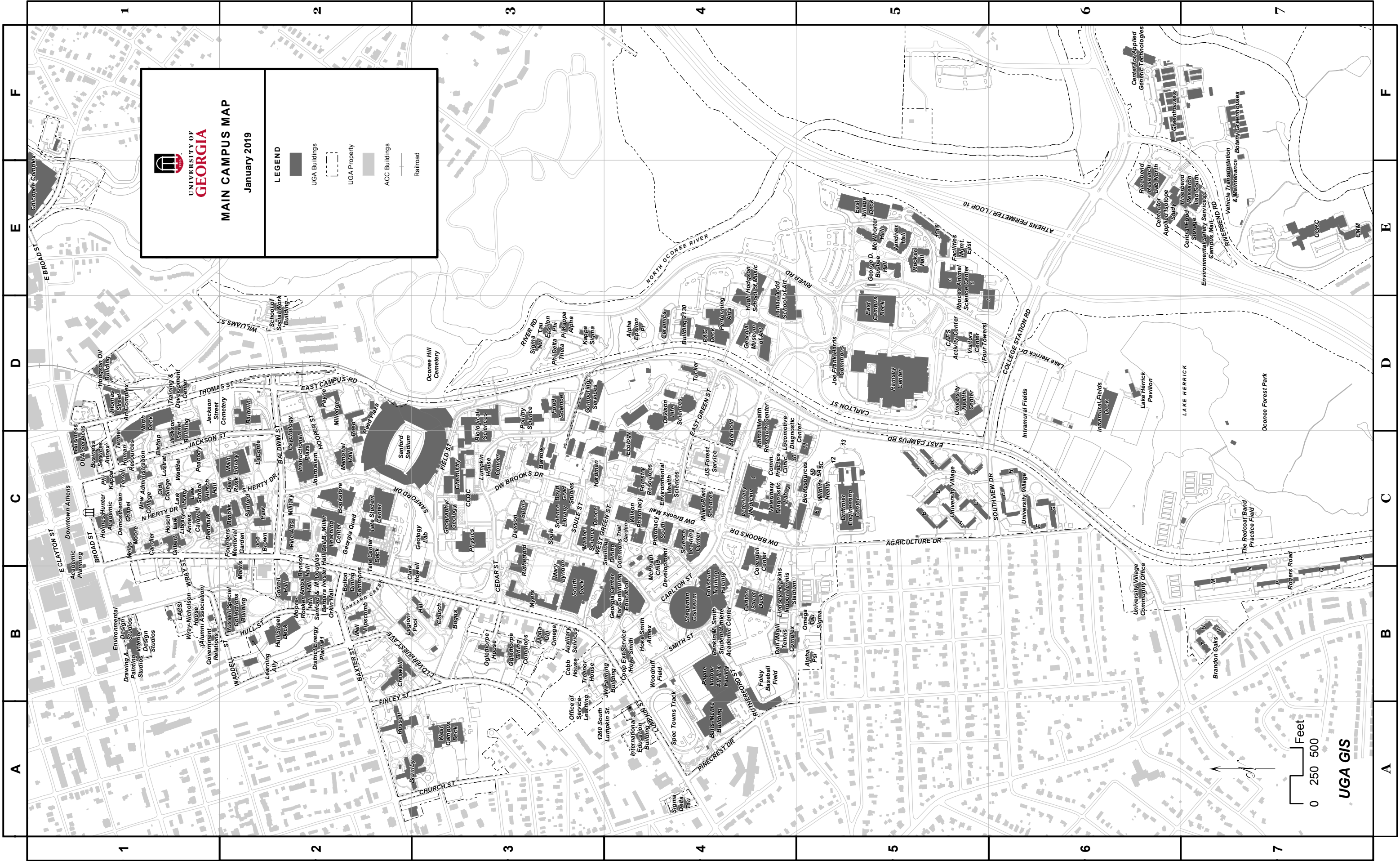
