The Business Learning Community at the University of Georgia is the new home of the state's flagship business school at the nation's birthplace of public higher education. Built in three phases spanning six years, the Business Learning Community is a remarkable testament to the public/private partnership between the state of Georgia and the many alumni and friends of the Terry College of Business who supported the Building Terry campaign through their private gifts.

The complex of six buildings provides the highly collaborative learning environment that Terry's faculty and staff have long envisioned for all business students, featuring modern classrooms, team rooms, and spacious common areas. Correll Hall was the first to open in 2015. The next phase, which included Amos Hall, Benson Hall, and Moore-Rooker Hall, opened two years later. The third and final phase of construction was completed in 2019. It features two buildings – Ivester Hall and Sanford and Barbara Orkin Hall – separated by the Coca-Cola Plaza.

General Information



ABOUT THE INSTITUTION

History and Location: Chartered by the Georgia General Assembly on January 27, 1785, The University of Georgia is the nation's first state-chartered university. In 1872, the University of Georgia was designated the state's land-grant institution and in 1980 was accorded sea-grant college status. The University's main campus is located in Athens-Clarke County, Georgia, approximately 60 miles northeast of the state capital of Atlanta.

Academic Schools and Colleges: The University is comprised of seventeen schools and colleges: Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, Arts and Sciences, Business, Ecology, Education, Engineering, Environment and Design, Family and Consumer Sciences, Forestry and Natural Resources, Graduate School, Journalism and Mass Communication, Law, Pharmacy, Public Health, Public and International Affairs, Social Work, and Veterinary Medicine.

Academic Programs and Degrees Conferred: The University of Georgia is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges as well as a variety of discipline-specific accrediting agencies. Academic offerings include 24 bachelor's degrees in 144 major fields; 33 master's degrees in 142 major fields; the specialist in education degree in 8 major fields; 4 doctoral degrees in 100 major fields; and professional degrees in Law, Pharmacy, and Veterinary Medicine. During the 2018-19 fiscal year, the University awarded 7,459 bachelor's degrees, 1,949 master's and specialist degrees, 488 doctoral degrees, and 429 professional degrees.

Faculty: Full-time professorial faculty in the fall of 2019 totaled 1,851. 95% of the full-time faculty were tenured or tenure-track, and 96% hold the doctorate or other terminal degree. Average salaries for the fiscal year 2019 were \$130,000 for professors; \$96,100 for associate professors; and \$90,100 for assistant professors.

Enrollment: Fall 2019 enrollment totaled 38,920, which included 29,848 undergraduates, 7,476 graduate students, and 1,596 first professional students. 94% of undergraduates and 77% of graduate and professional students were enrolled on a full-time basis. The undergraduate student body was 43% male and 30% minority. There were 122 foreign countries represented among the 1,106 undergraduate and 1,687 graduate and professional non-US citizens enrolled in fall 2019.

Admissions/Retention: 5,489 first-time freshmen enrolled for fall 2019. 41% of all admitted freshmen enrolled, and 20% of all freshman applicants enrolled. The average total SAT score for entering freshmen was 1334. 4,458 or 81% of new freshmen attended 469 Georgia high schools. On average, 94.8% of first-time full-time freshmen return for their sophomore year. 70% of all undergraduate transfer applicants were accepted, and 1,239 enrolled for fall 2019. 52% of accepted new graduate students enrolled in fall 2019.

Costs: Academic year 2019-20 tuition and fees totaled \$12,080 for new resident undergraduates and \$31,120 for new nonresident undergraduates. Academic year 2019-20 estimated cost of attendance for resident undergraduates totaled \$27,450. This amount included tuition, mandatory fees, books, supplies, room, board, and other expenses.

Finance: For fiscal year 2019, total revenues exceeded \$1.94 billion and included \$507 million from state appropriations. 18.1% of total operating expenditures were designated for instruction and 24.0% for research. Sponsored awards for fiscal year 2019 totaled \$298,167,285.

Physical Facilities: The University occupies and maintains over 22 million square feet of space. The main campus includes 478 buildings for a total of 18,086,588 square feet. Twelve major building projects were completed during 2019 for a total cost of over \$90 million. The University's fall 2019 land holdings totaled 38,866 acres in 29 Georgia counties.

THE MISSION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA

The University of Georgia, a land-grant and sea-grant university with statewide commitments and responsibilities, is the state's oldest, most comprehensive and most diversified institution of higher education. Its motto, "to teach, to serve, and to inquire into the nature of things," reflects the University's integral and unique role in the conservation and enhancement of the state's and nation's intellectual, cultural, and environmental heritage.

The University of Georgia shares with the other research universities of the University System of Georgia the following core characteristics:

- a statewide responsibility and commitment to excellence and academic achievements having national and international recognition;
- a commitment to excellence in a teaching/learning environment dedicated to serving a diverse and well-prepared student body, to promoting high levels of student achievement, and to providing appropriate academic support services;
- a commitment to excellence in research, scholarship, and creative endeavors that are focused on organized programs to create, maintain, and apply new knowledge and theories; that promote instructional quality and effectiveness; and that enhance institutionally relevant faculty qualifications;
- a commitment to excellence in public service, economic development, and technical assistance activities designed to address the strategic needs of the state of Georgia along with a comprehensive offering of continuing education designed to meet the needs of Georgia's citizens in life-long learning and professional education;
- a wide range of academic and professional programming at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels.

With its statewide mission and core characteristics, the University of Georgia endeavors to prepare the University community and the state for full participation in the global society of the twenty-first century. Through its programs and practices, it seeks to foster the understanding of and respect for cultural differences necessary for an enlightened and educated citizenry. It further provides for cultural, ethnic, gender, and racial diversity in the faculty, staff, and student body. The University is committed to preparing the University community to appreciate the critical importance of a quality environment to an interdependent global society.

As a comprehensive land-grant and sea-grant institution, the University of Georgia offers baccalaureate, master's, doctoral, and professional degrees in the arts, humanities, social sciences, biological sciences, physical sciences, agricultural and environmental sciences, business, ecology, engineering, environmental design, family and consumer sciences, forest resources, journalism and mass communication, education, law, pharmacy, public health, social work, and veterinary medicine. The university is also home to the Augusta University/University of Georgia Medical Partnership.

The University attracts students nationally and internationally as well as from within Georgia. It offers the state's broadest array of possibilities in graduate and professional education, and thus a large minority of the student body is post-baccalaureate. The predominantly Georgian undergraduate student body is a mix of highly qualified students originally admitted as freshmen and selected transfer students principally from other University System institutions.

With original scholarship, basic and applied research, and creative activities constituting an essential core from which to draw, the impact of the land-grant and sea-grant mission is reflected throughout the state. Cooperative extension, continuing education, public service, experiment stations, and technology transfer are all designed to enhance the well-being of the citizens of Georgia through their roles in economic, social, and community development.

As it has been historically, the University of Georgia is responsive to the evolution of the state's educational, social, and economic needs. It aspires through its strategic planning to even closer contact and interaction with public and private institutions throughout the state as well as with the citizens it serves.

UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA 2020 STRATEGIC PLAN

As the University's 2020 Strategic Plan drew to a close in 2019, the University Council Strategic Planning Committee completed a thorough evaluation of progress on the plan. The committee concluded in its November 2019 report to the University Council that *"the University has made substantial progress over the last 10 years in each of the seven strategic directions and on many of the specific priorities set within each direction. It is clear that University resources and effort have been effective in working toward priorities of the 2020 plan."*

UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA 2025 STRATEGIC PLAN

In November 2018, President Morehead charged a committee to develop a new strategic plan to guide the University from 2020 to 2025. The plan was approved in September 2019 and included 13 institutional goals under three mission-centered strategic directions:

Promoting Excellence in Teaching and Learning

- Expand experiential learning opportunities for all students.
- Enhance training, support, and recognition for all who provide instruction.
- Enhance infrastructure and support for evidence-based teaching methods across the curriculum.
- Promote academic access and success for all students, with particular consideration for underrepresented, rural, first-generation, and other underserved students.

Growing Research, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship

- Provide resources, support, and incentives to nurture a diverse and inclusive culture of excellence in research, innovation, and entrepreneurship.
- Promote collaboration among academic units and between these units and external organizations to drive interdisciplinary research and commercial activity.
- Align the human and physical capital of the University to expand the research enterprise and fuel innovation and entrepreneurship at all levels of the organization.
- Enhance communications about the University's strengths in research, innovation, and entrepreneurship and the impact of those activities on local, state, national, and international communities.

Strengthening Partnerships with Communities across Georgia and around the World

- Increase collaborative, community-focused research, scholarship, technical assistance, and training in Georgia, across the nation, and world.
- Strengthen UGA's role in economic development across the State, with a particular emphasis on underserved communities.
- Broaden opportunities for students to engage with the diversity of communities in Georgia and across the nation and world on locally identified needs and issues.
- Develop high-impact global partnerships that engage and support UGA areas of research and service excellence.
- Strengthen communications regarding how UGA sustainably supports and benefits communities through research, teaching, and public service.

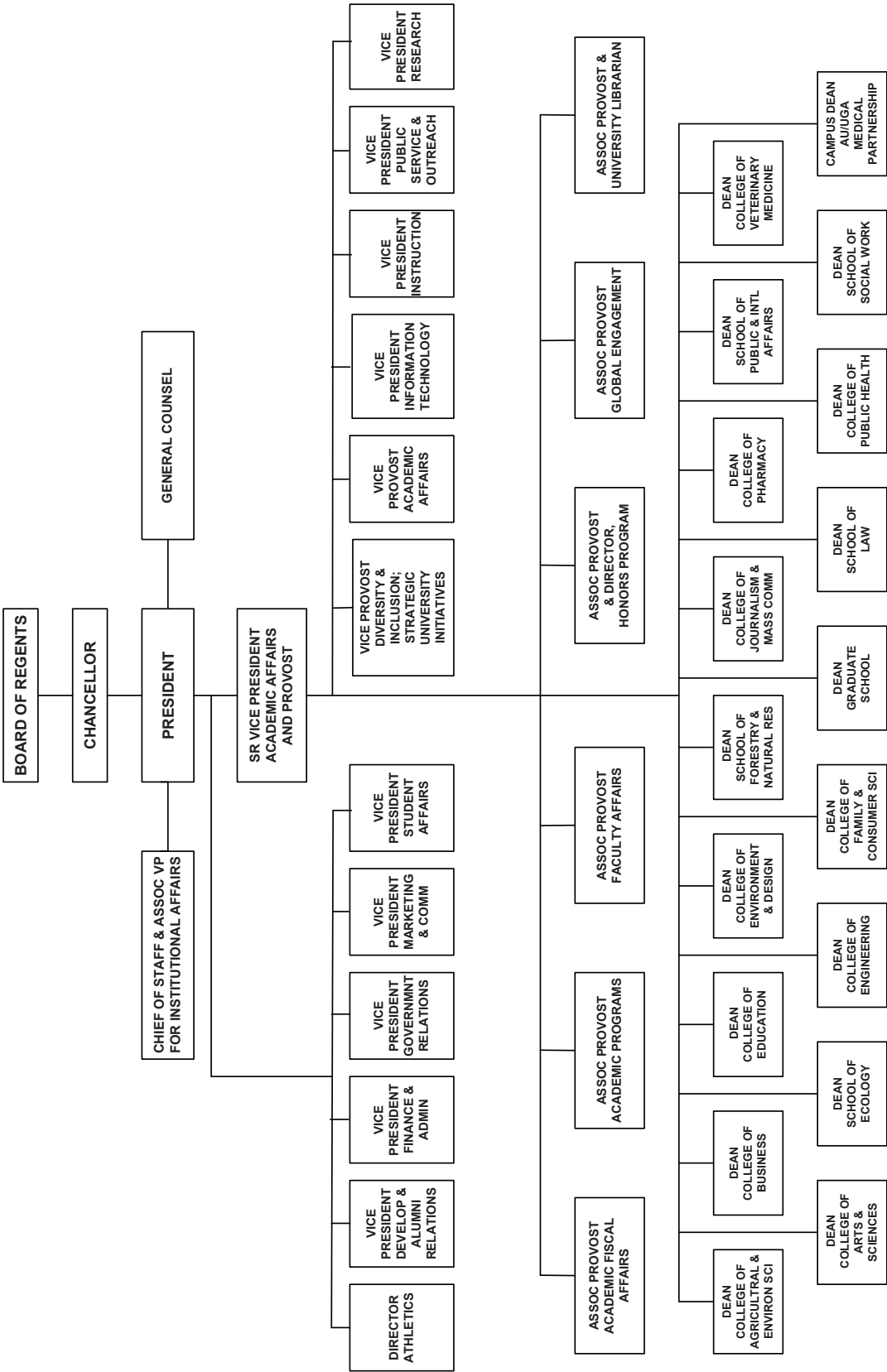

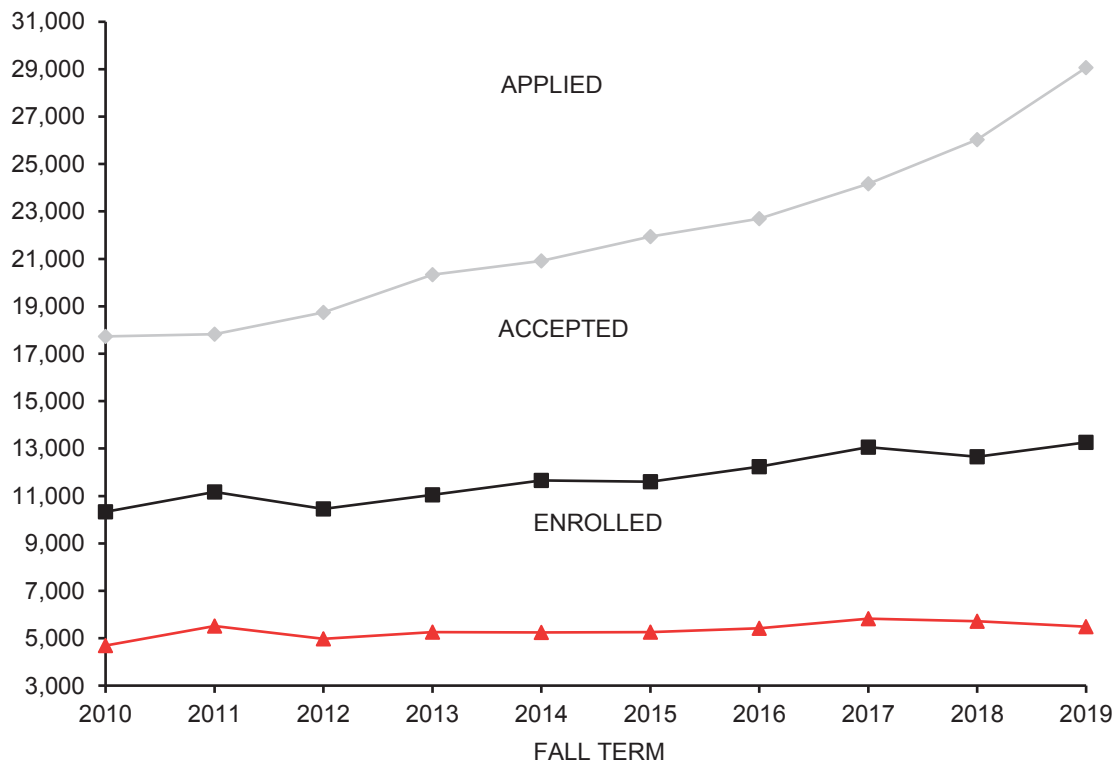

FALL TERMS 2010-2019



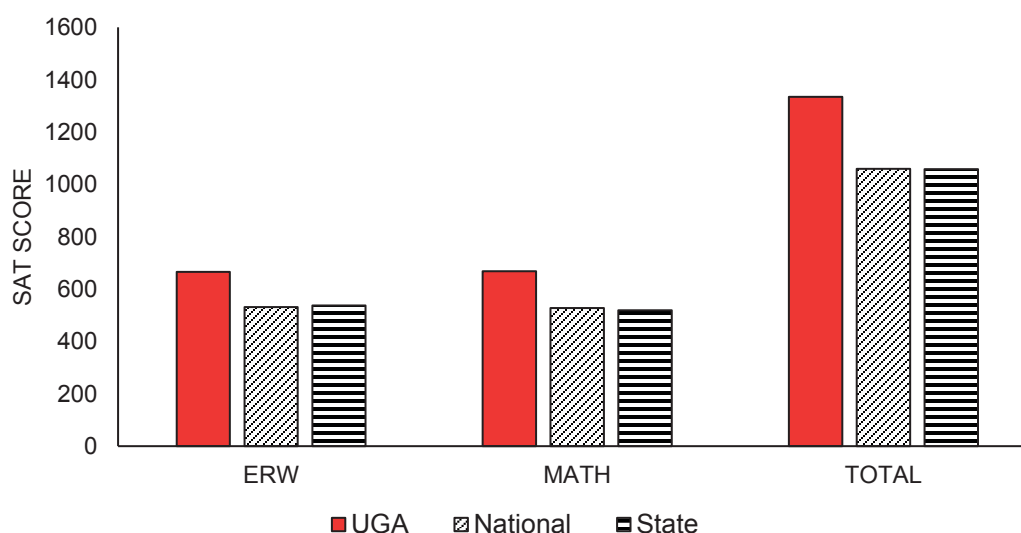

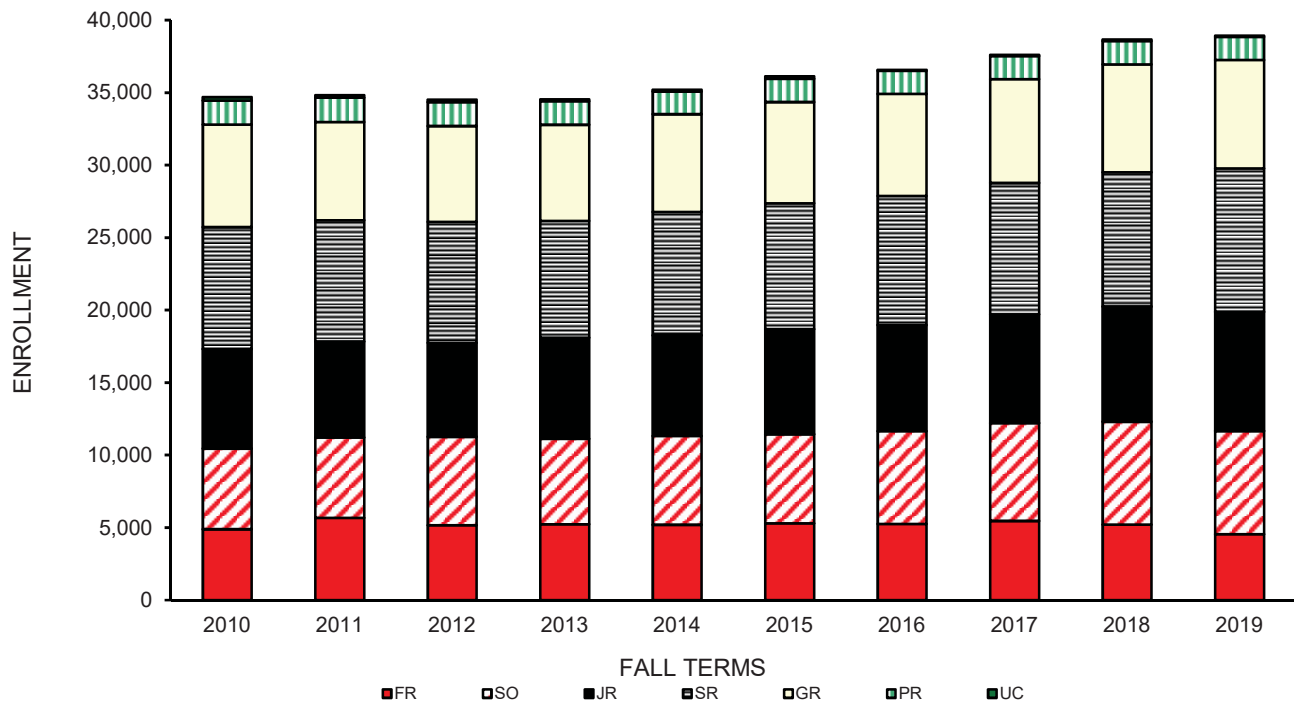

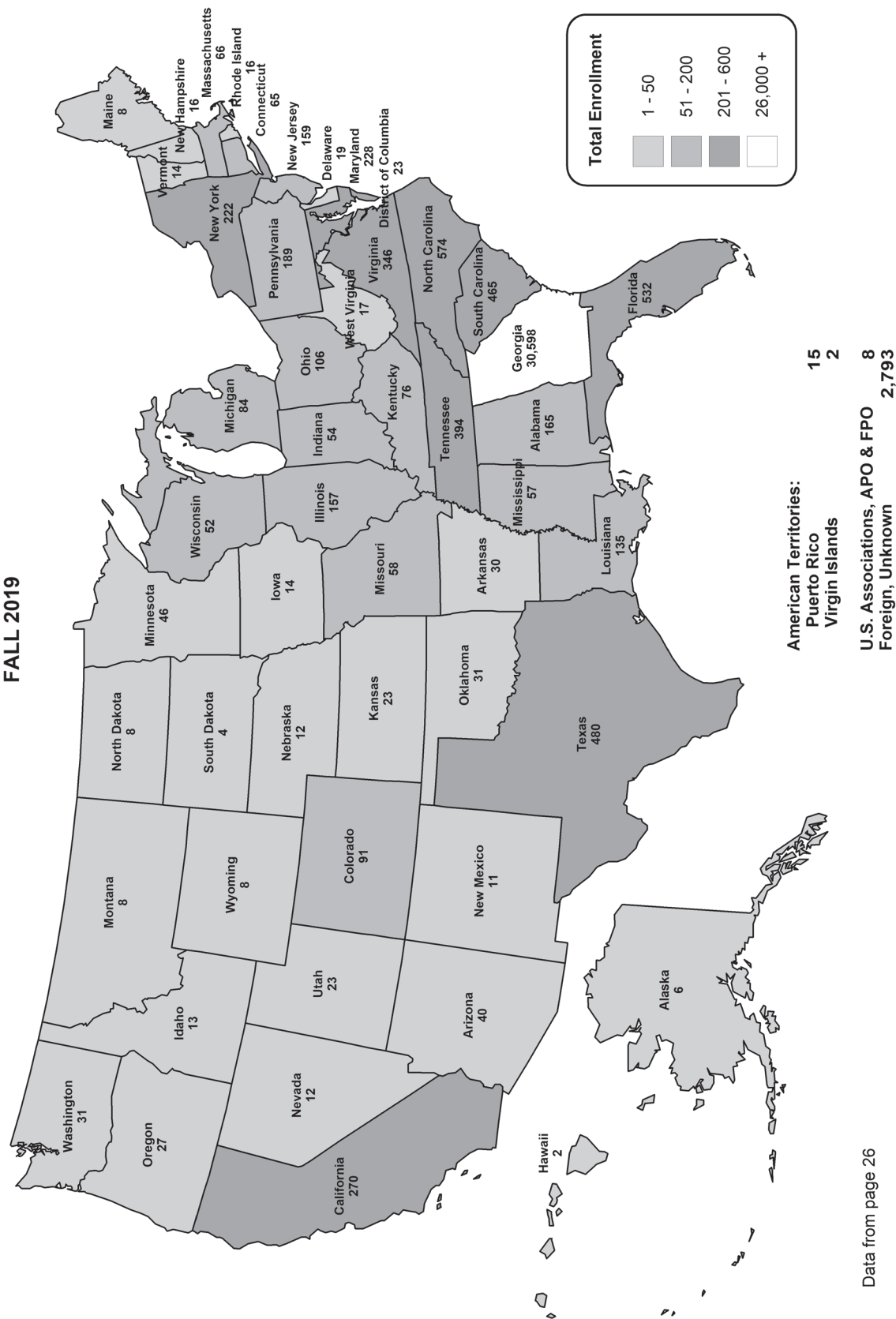

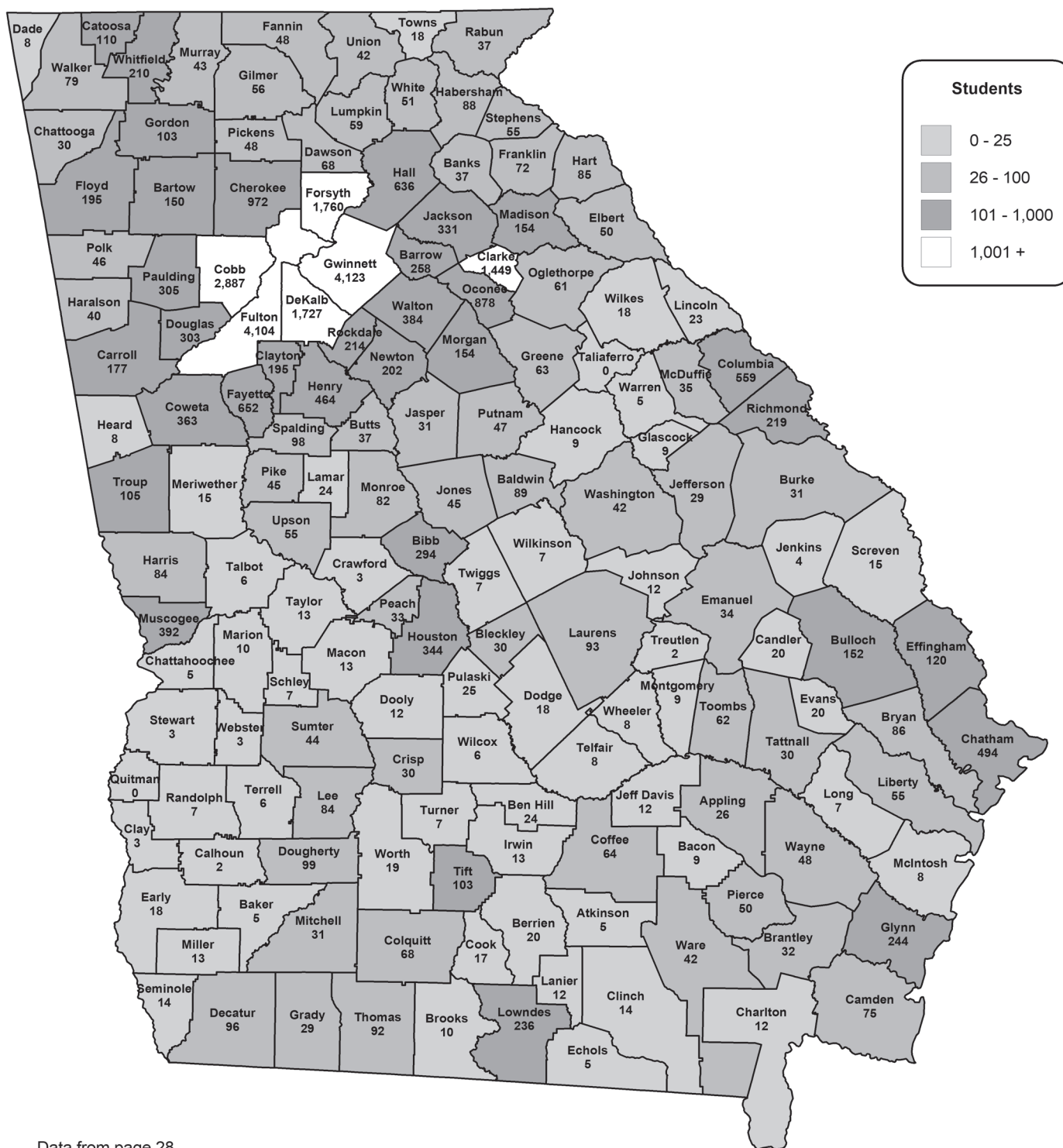

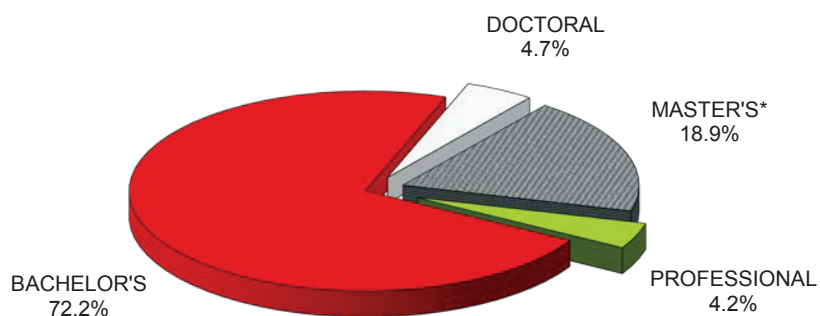

FISCAL YEAR 2018-19**



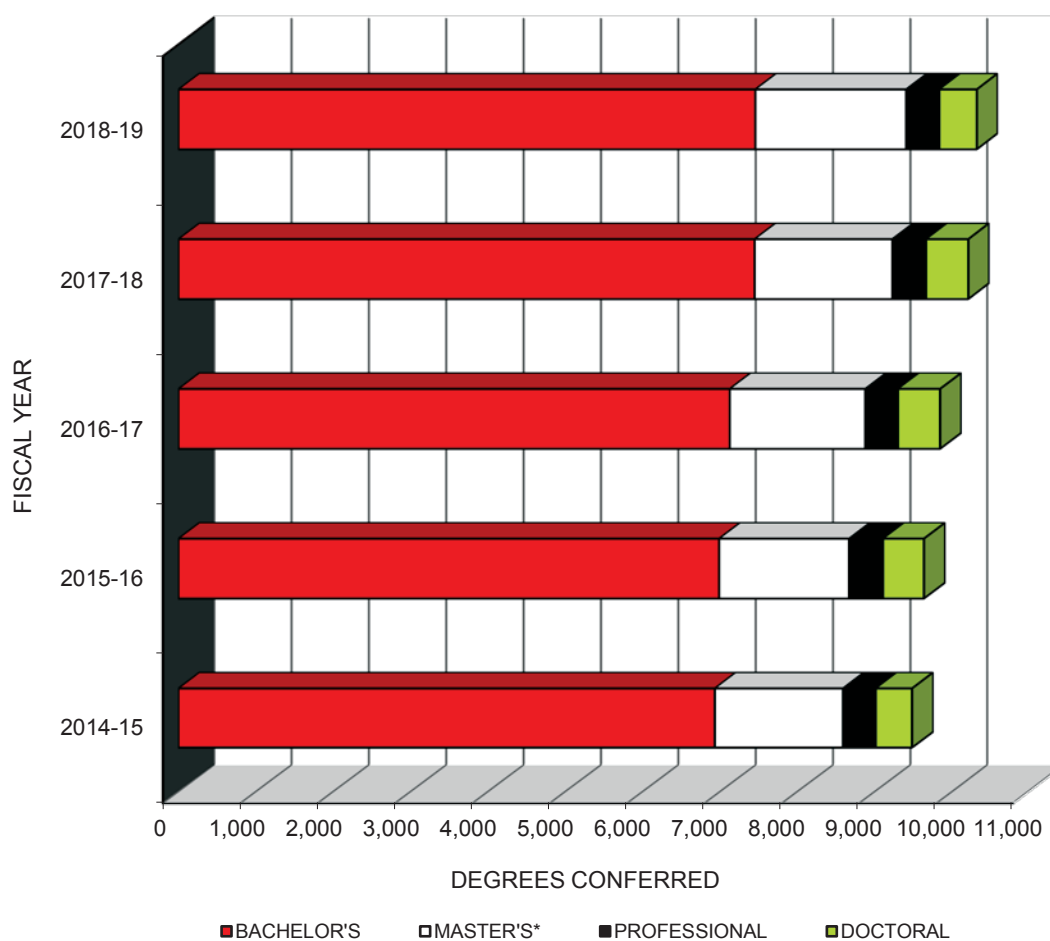

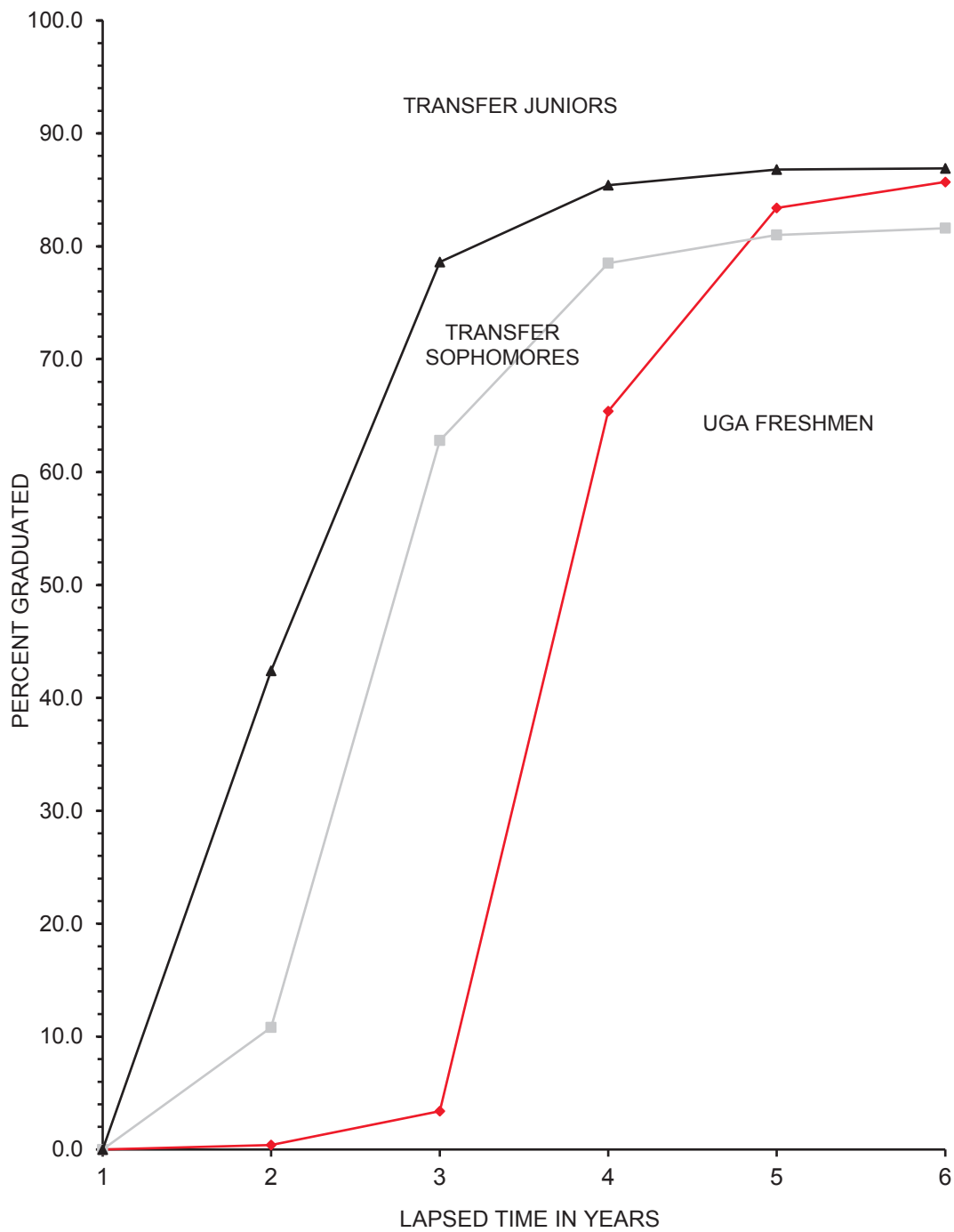

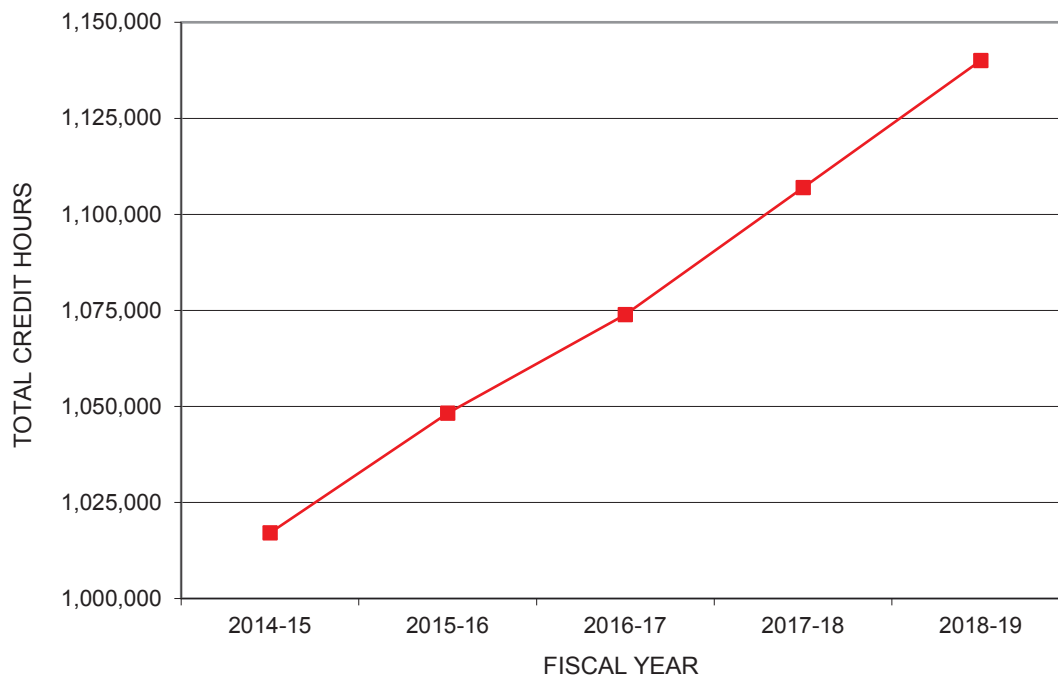

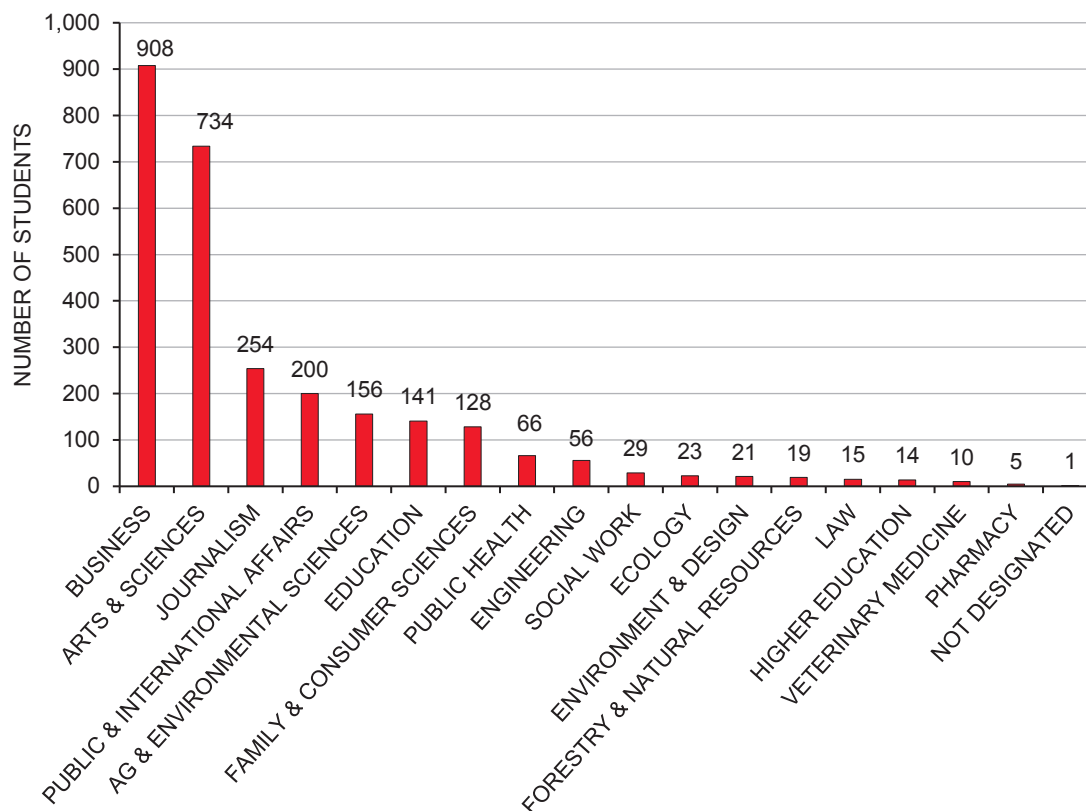

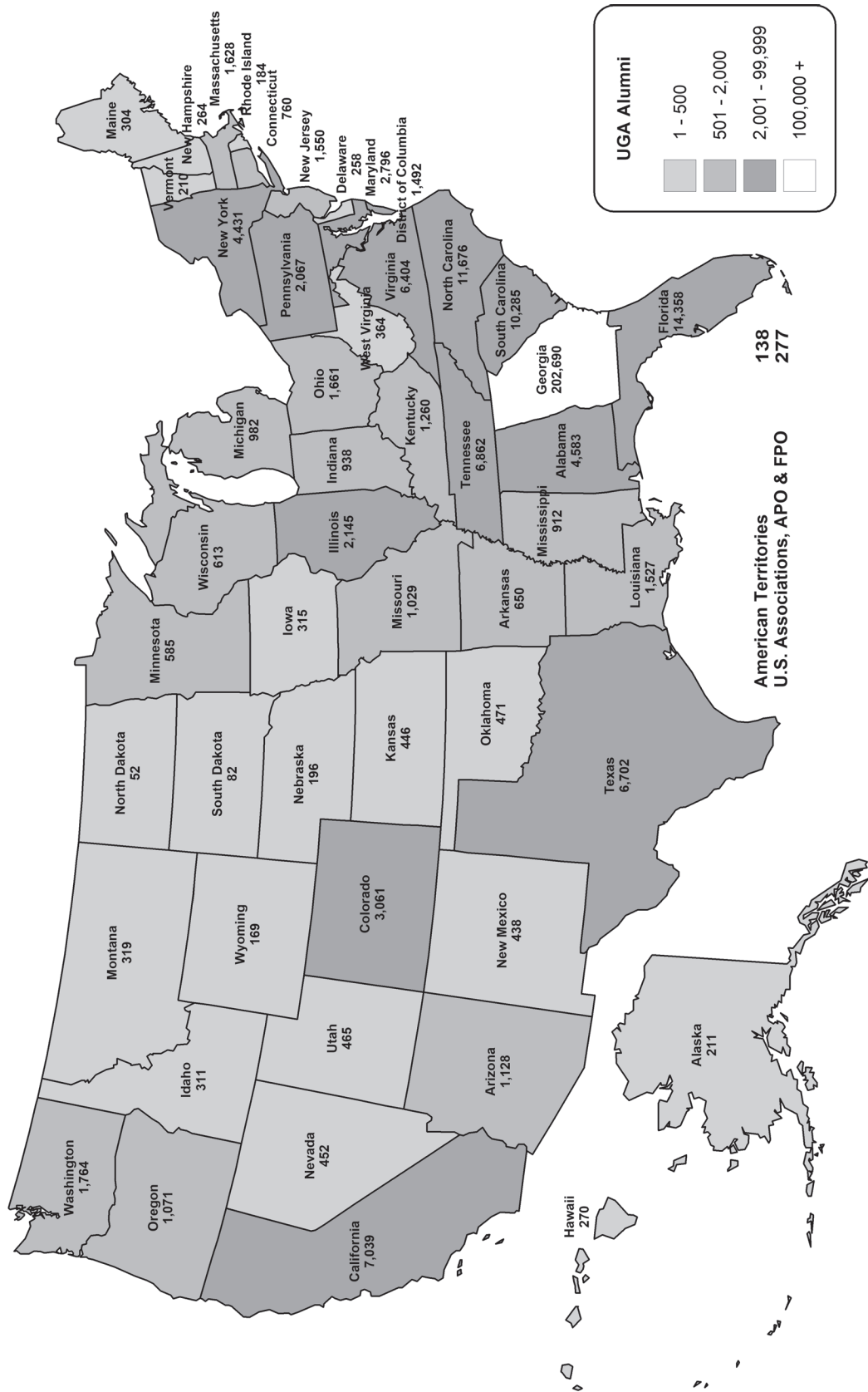

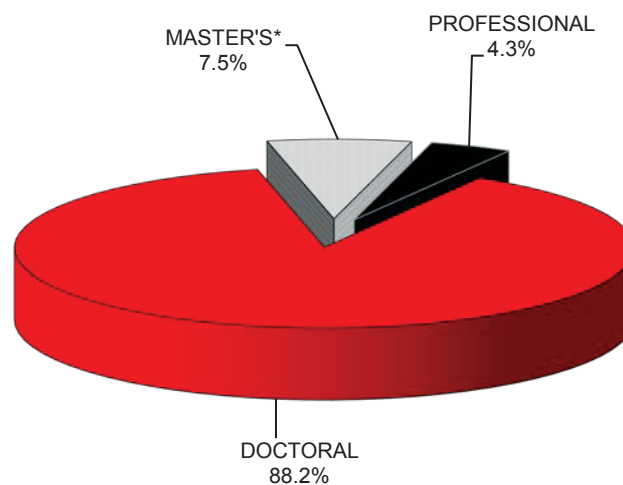

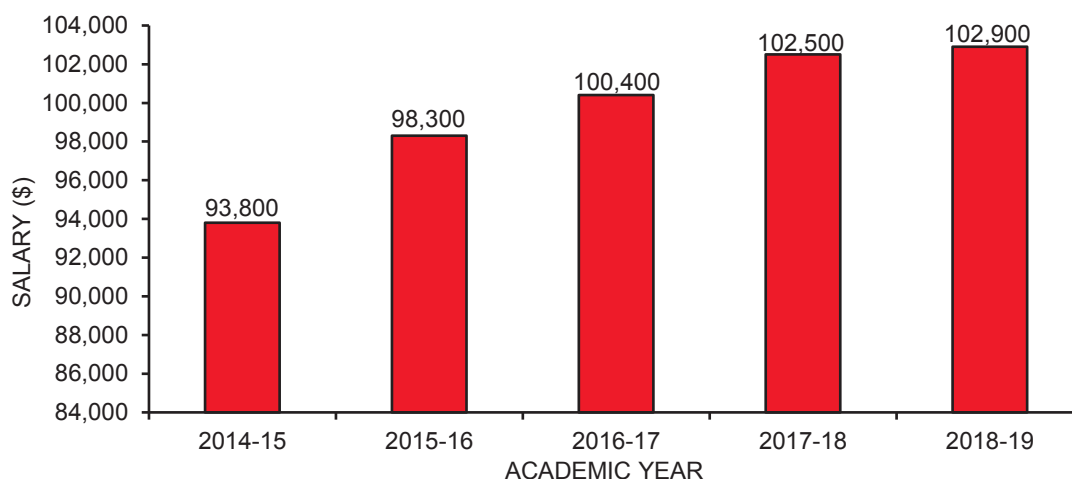

ACADEMIC YEARS 2014-15 THROUGH 2018-19**



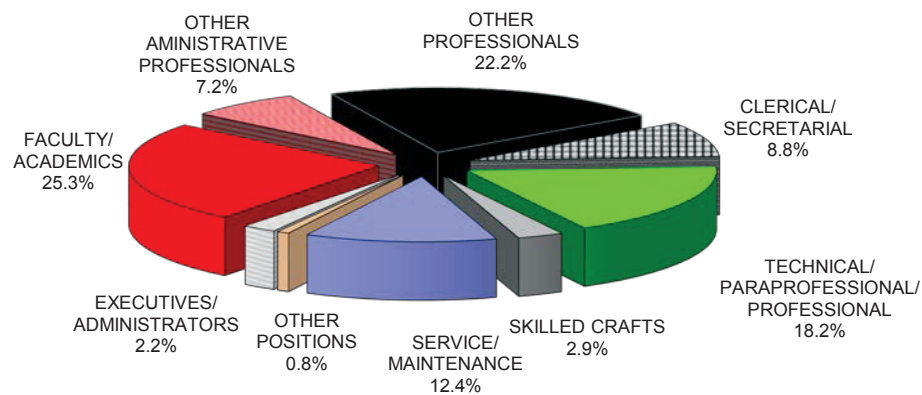

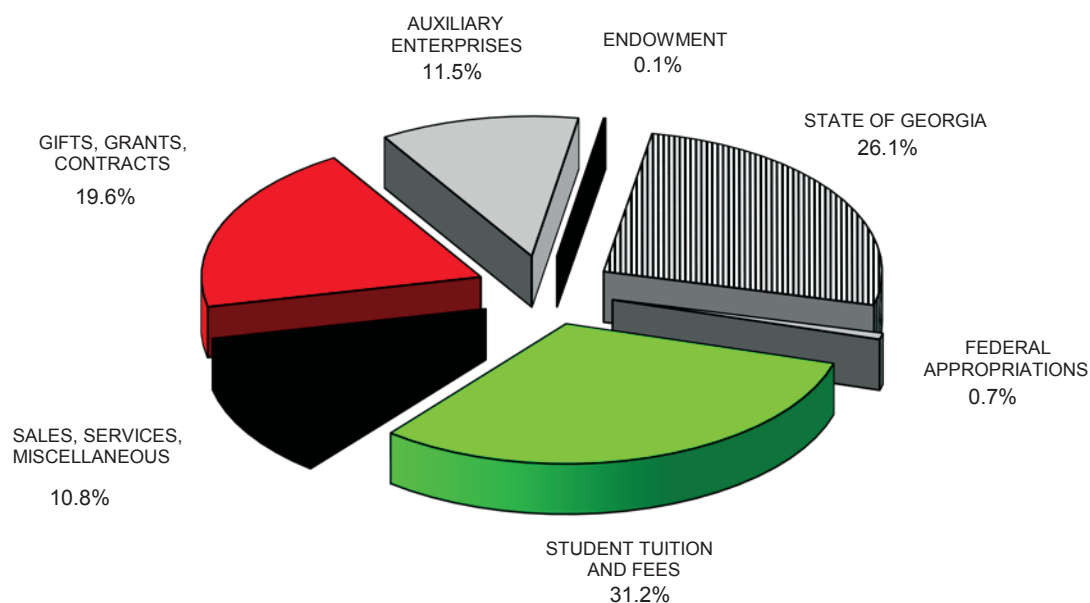

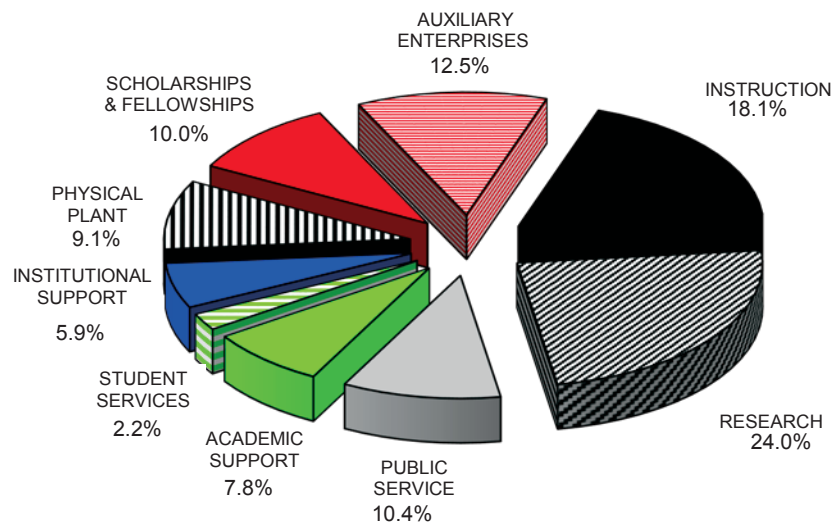

FISCAL YEAR 2018-19**

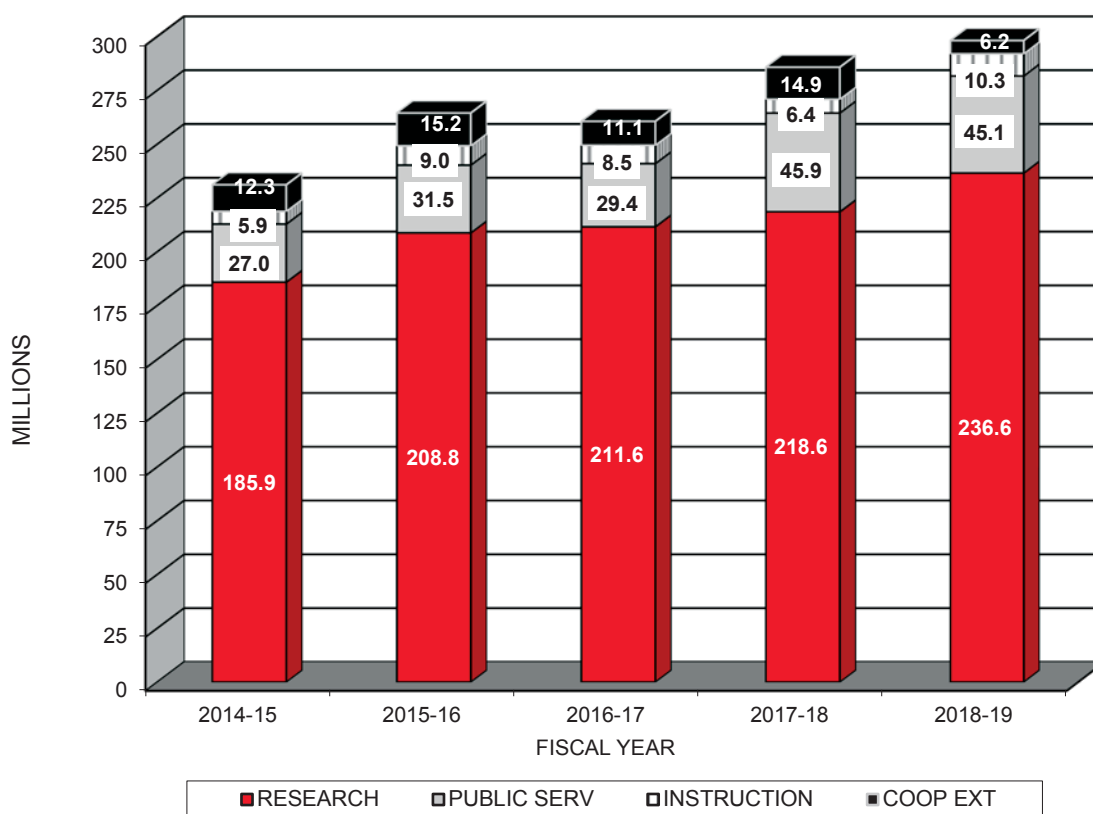

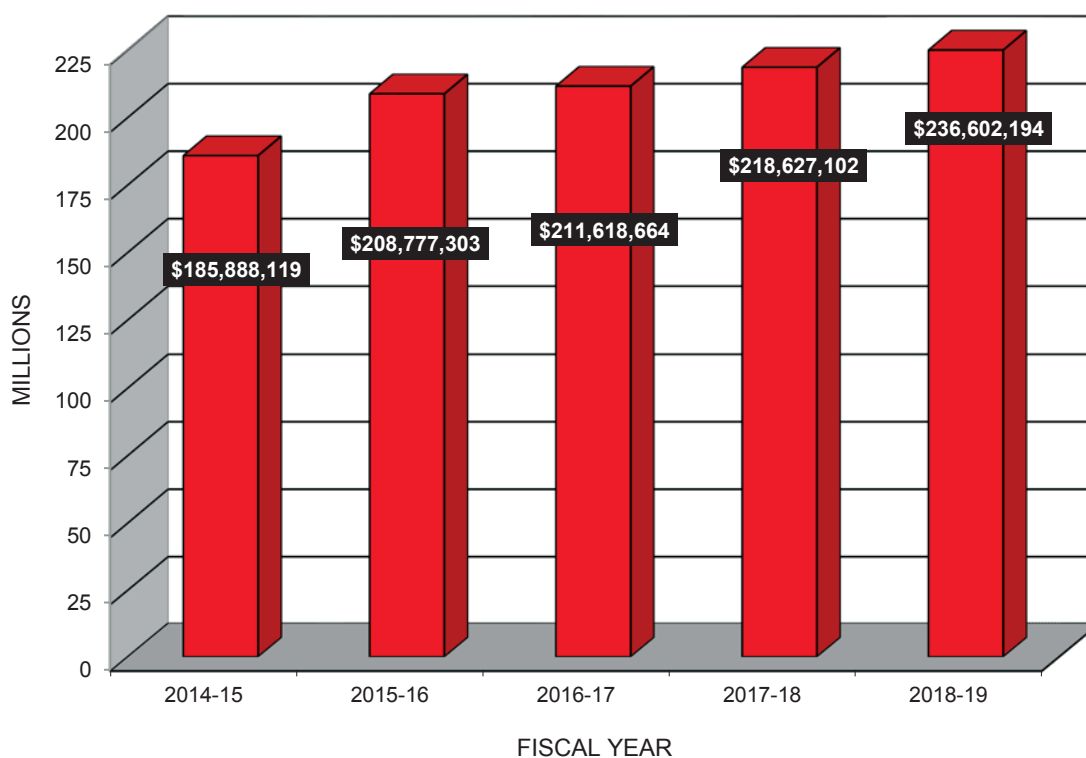

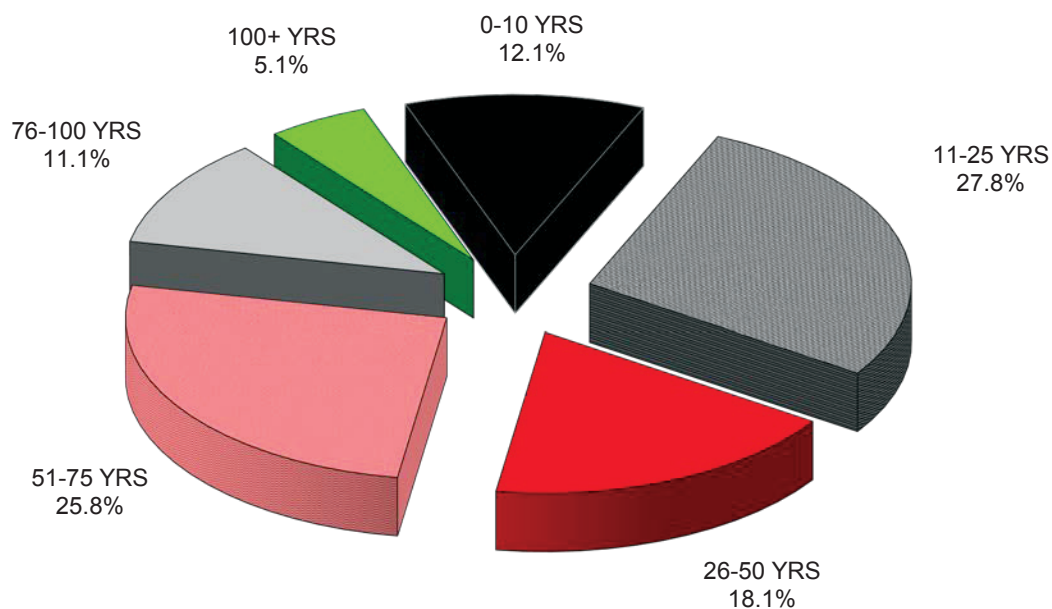
