Any students living in those spaces are counted under the halls where they are originally assigned. Since these spaces were intentionally withheld from regular occupancy during the 2021-2022 school year, the capacities of these buildings have been adjusted to reflect that decision.

³Three, one-bedroom apartment buildings (Buildings J, K and L) are expanded for undergraduate housing with a capacity of 2 students per apartment. For the remaining buildings in University Village, capacity is determined by the number of individual contracts available per apartment.

⁴Health Sciences Campus townhome capacity is determined by the number of individual contracts available per apartment.
